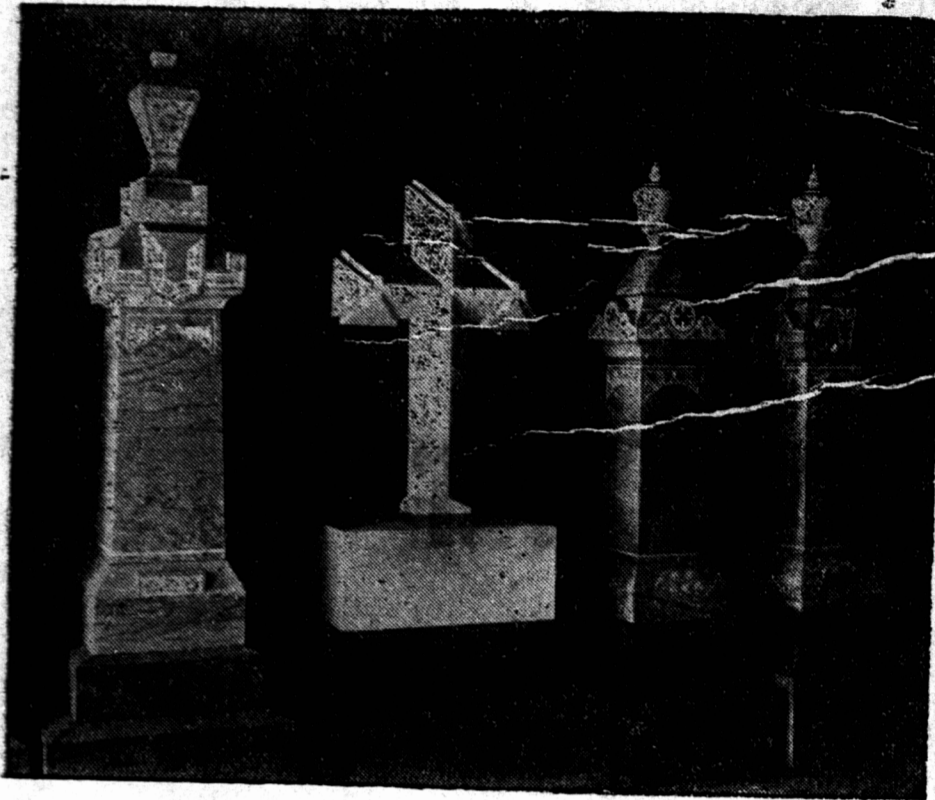


Portrait of the Queen.
