### THE AUTOMOBILE QUESTION.

This is automobile day in Milton and that peaceful hamlet, named for the immortal poet who sang in strains sublime of Paradise lost, are much exercised as to how their Eden shall be protected against the modern devices of the arch enemy. We do not know whether a motor car has ever yet visited Milton, but we do know that many worthy people in the country districts had rather meet a bear robbed of her whelps on a narrow road than one of these self-moving vehicles. For the present they are secure, protected by the mud and the quagmires through which horses can make their way slowly, but which are impassable as a Serbian bog to the motor car. It is to be hoped that some modus vivendi may be established by which, at least on market days and Sundays, the main thoroughfares leading to the city shall be as safe as they have hitherto been. There is, we believe, an Order in Council having the force of law, which requires all drivers of railway locomotives to be careful to avoid needless frightening of horses and cattle. We doubt not that our auto drivers will exercise due care in the same matter. At any rate it is quite within the power of our Government and Legislature, which have full control of the highways, to make such regulations as will conserve the public safety.

It was given out that the promised short session at Ottawa may be a long one, and that the expected fall session might not take place. Of course the blame was placed upon the Opposition by the powers that be. The Opposition, however, have a duty to perform in the way of inquiry and criticism, and the country expects that duty to be performed. Now we are told that there will be a fall session beginning in November even if the present session lasts till October.

This is a season of earthquakes and volcanic activity. Hecla in the far north has become active closely after a notable eruption of Vesuvius in the Mediterranean. California has been severely shaken and even our stable island has felt a tremor in its foundations of sandstone. These disturbances are indications of pressure within the earth's crust, whether caused by steam, or chemical, or electric action, or by the falling in of a position of the rock wall, the scientific world does not know. But it is well that there are safety-valves for such emergencies.

It seems not unlikely that the Sunday Observance Bill now before Parliament may be so amended as to allow the Legislature of each Province considerable latitude in controlling the observance of the day. In any case the law hitherto in force in this Province, which law was enacted before the Island entered the union with Canada, will remain in force until altered or repealed by the Ottawa Parliament. It is regrettable that each Province should not be empowered to deal with this important subject for itself. There is a wide variety of opinion in different Provinces on this subject. Our people are earnestly desirous to preserve the day of worship and of rest and to have it safe guarded.

### THE FAMINE FUND.

The season is advancing, the list has been open a reasonable length of time, and promptness in a matter of so much urgency is important. Thursday May 10th is polling day for the repeal of the Canada Temperance Act in King's County. We hope our temperance friends will be active and roll up a decisive majority in favor of prohibition on that day.

### IRISH EMIGRATION STAYED

DUBLIN, April 30.—The emigration statistics of Ireland show that there has been a decrease of 6,225 in the number of natives leaving the country in 1905, as compared with 1904. The figures are: 1904, 36,296; 1905, 30,076. The largest number of emigrants left Ulster, while Leinster lost fewer than any other province. The figures were 10,236 and 3,987.

### EDITOR'S MAIL

### OPEN AND CLOSE SEASONS FOR GAME.

Sir:—In order that none of your readers may get into trouble through ignorance of what are the existing game and fishery regulations, kindly give space for the following information:

The time for smelt fishing closed on April 1st. It is illegal to catch smelts between April 1st and July 1st. Salmon may be caught up to August 31st, but no foul or spent fish may be taken or killed. Trout fishing commenced on April 1st and trout can be taken until September 30th. It is unlawful to capture trout by any other means than by angling.

According to the Game Act, 1906, Owls, Crows, Hawks, and English Sparrows may be killed at any time, but of all other birds, whether game birds or not, only geese and brant may be shot before August 30th. Goose shooting closes on May 10th, and brant shooting on June 10th. It is against the law to shoot either geese or brant between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise next morning, or to use a rifle in hunting them.
