CONVENTION OF TEACHERS.—Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, the 24th, 25th and 26th, inst., will be important days in the calendars of the school teachers of this province. On those dates will be held the annual convention of the Provincial Teachers' Association. A program of more than usual interest is being arranged as regards the business of the convention. There will be lectures and addresses, and discussions on a variety of subjects of the utmost interest to the teaching profession. It is expected that there will be in attendance at the convention a number of very prominent educationists of the Dominion and the United States, and besides the addresses that are expected from them, there will be a number of topical papers contributed by local educational authorities. An especially interesting subject which it is expected will be dealt with by one of the visiting educationists will be the question of the abnormal child. One of the notable visitors will be Dr. Tait, Professor of Psychology at MacGill University, who it is expected will deliver more than one address on important educational questions.

I., both for size, and quality of their silver black fur. This pair is from the Raynor, Dalton, Oulton & Champion strain. It is needless to say the black beauties came in for a great deal of admiration en route of their destination at Salisbury. Dr. B. F. Reade is enthusiastic over the future of the fox industry, and rightly claims that New Brunswick with its soil and climatic conditions, so much like the Island, is just as suitable for the raising of foxes, and the success already experienced at the Coverdale and Scotch Settlement ranches near Moncton seem to prove his contention. Dr. Reade found the fox business good country the Strait with prices very steady and a lot of American capital coming in. A lot of new companies are being formed, and there is no reason why New Brunswick should not share in the enormous profits that are being made in this new industry.
