RESIGNS SEAT IN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS

Geo. B. Jones, Former Conservative Min. Of Labor In Meighen Govt. Tenders Resignation, But Will Seek Vindication Of His Action By Re-Election For Royal, N. B.

OTTAWA, Ont., April 12 — (By The Canadian Press)—Definite announcement was made here tonight that George B. Jones, former Conservative Minister of Labor, who resigned his seat in the House of Commons today, will proceed at once to New Brunswick and seek vindication of his action by re-election for Royal. By-election writs will probably be issued shortly.

Learning that by reason of the furnishing of relief supplies to destitute Indians by Jones Bros. Apoquo, N. B., of which he is a partner, on orders of the Indian medical director, was a contravention of the House of Commons Act, Mr. Jones handed his resignation to Mr. Speaker Black today. The resignation together with a letter from Mr. Jones, was read shortly after the opening of proceedings in the Commons this afternoon.

The store is not operated by Mr. Jones personally and the firm is an unincorporated one. If the firm had been incorporated, the provisions of the act would not apply.

The relief furnished to the needy Indians was small. Covering a period of eighteen months, the goods supplied amount to \$700 in all. Many of these Indians live four and five miles from Apoquo.

Mr. Jones was first elected to the Dominion Parliament as representative for Royal in the general election of 1921, and was re-elected in the general elections of 1925, 1926 and 1930. In the 1930 general election he had a majority of 2,924 votes over his Liberal opponent. When the Meighen Government was in office in 1926, Mr. Jones was Minister of Labor.
