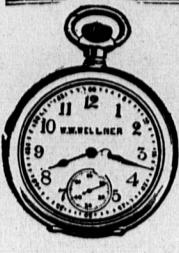

At the county court yesterday John Anderson of Queens Arms was convicted of a first offence of the Prohibition Act and was fined three months or \$100 and costs. John McMurrer of Royalty was also convicted of a first offence of the Prohibition Act and judgment will be given on Tuesday at 9.30. Leonard Meek of Charlottetown Royalty was up for a first offence of the Prohibition Act and the case was adjourned for a week.

Guardian readers in Queen's County will be interested in knowing that at a meeting of the electors of the Lower Freetown School District, held in the hall on Sept. 19th presided over by Isaac Lidstone, the following resolutions were unanimously passed: Whereas the mid-summer vacation in the country schools is longer than is necessary and whereas a shorter vacation would be greatly to the interest of the pupils therefore resolved that the Legislature be asked to shorten the mid-summer vacation making it uniform in length with the spring and fall vacations. Whereas the great majority of the population of P. E. I. is engaged in agricultural pursuits and whereas an education along agricultural lines would be a great benefit and a great aid to the farmers of this country and whereas the education imparted to the youths in the country schools and at the P. W. C. tends to educate the young people away from the farm therefore resolved that the Legislature be asked to introduce a system of education into our country schools and the Prince of Wales College that will have for its object, first and foremost, the teaching of agriculture in all its branches. Whereas the horse walks directly in front of the horse walks a single track, which tends to the formation of slues and pitches, and whereas said track does not permit of a two-horse team, and whereas if single sleighs were constructed to permit of the horse walking a double track, so hard as to almost prevent the formation of slues and pitches, therefore resolved that the Legislature be asked to make it compulsory, within a reasonable time after the passing of the Act, that all sleighs be constructed so as to permit of the horse walking in the runner track. Whereas the telephone is a great convenience and a cheap and easy method of communication and whereas rural lines would be a great benefit to the general public, therefore resolved that the Legislature be asked to procure by purchase or otherwise the right to construct rural lines at cost. Whereas "pack-peddlars" or travelling merchants have become a great nuisance to the people of this Province and whereas it would be a great relief and comfort of the general public if restrictions were placed upon them therefore resolved that the Legislature be asked to impose a license fee of not less than five hundred dollars per year on such persons. Resolved that copies of the above resolutions be sent to the representatives in, and to the candidates for, the Legislature in this, the fourth District of Prince, and further resolved that copies of said resolutions be sent to the press for publication and that this meeting respectfully ask, through the press, the co-operation of all the school districts on the Island in the effort to secure the passing of laws based on the above resolutions.
