**A LETTER FROM TWO ADMIRERS OF THE GUARDIAN**

Snappy Criticism of The Attitude of Canadians Towards The States.

Quincy, Mass., Jan. 9, 1907.

Sir—A Happy New Year to you and to all readers of the Royal Daily. Please allow two natives of So. Queen's to express their appreciation of the Guardian's unexampled enterprise. No wonder everybody reads the Guardian. "Two lads" are not college bred, we don't pretend to know it all—however we have enough sense to know a good thing when we see it, and we say the Guardian is all right on the Temperance Question; and is therefore a friend of humanity. No person ever received good from a too near acquaintance with the "red eyed god," again we like the Guardian because it is a paper for all classes of thinkers—all shades of opinion receiving justice and consideration. The attention of The Guardian on public questions carry more weight than do all the long winded pleadings of the party papers. Again "Islander Abroad" find the fresh, sparkling local news most interesting, and if only we had better mail service from the I-land, your circulation in the New England States would increase greatly. We list also no longer subjects of King Edward, and we wish to take back a letter to the Editor whose good nature we permeate will allow us the privilege of the Guardian, and probably all Canadian Journals, have a habit of pointing out the wickedness, the cussedness of the Yankees and regarding Canadians as "niggers" so much better.

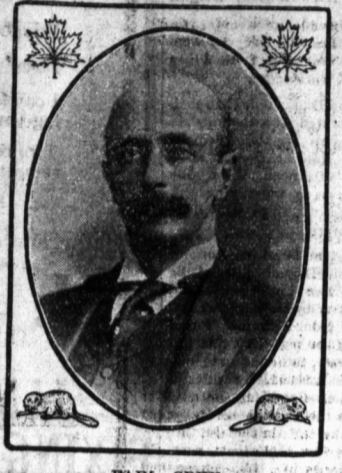

**MR. ROOT AND EARL GREY MAY SETTLE ALL CONTROVERSIES**

Approaching Conference at Ottawa Expected to Find Basis for Ending All Anglo-American Disputes—Canada the Judge.

LONDON, Jan. 10.—The Associated Press learns that the exchange of certain definite proposals between the United States and Great Britain for the purpose of clearing up the outstanding differences between the United States and Canada have reached a rather advanced stage, so well informed circles not only hope but believe that the approaching meeting between Secretary Root and Earl Grey, Governor General of Canada, at Ottawa, will result in arranging some, if not all, of the long pending controversies.

Although the visit is officially described as private, no secret is made in Government quarters that as the visit follows the exchanges which have been going on between Washington, London and Ottawa in which Secretary Root first formulated a detailed plan of adjustment, which, upon its receipt here, was forwarded to Ottawa, the latter's reply having only recently been received. A high colonial official said to the Associated Press today:

"We know now that both sides desire to 'clear the slate,' to use Mr. Root's own phrase in one of his communications, and we have reason to believe that this will at least be partially accomplished, before the assembling of the colonial conference in April. Mr. Root's plan for settling the questions between the United States and Great Britain, was brought to England by Sir Mortimer Durant last May, since when no time has been lost in working toward final adjustment. After Mr. Root's plan had been referred by the Foreign office to the Colonial office, the whole question was submitted to Canada, as it was felt that the latter most indicate the lines of acceptance or dissent. The imperial government made certain suggestions, but did not seek to lay down the law to the latter. In due course Canada's reply was received, disclosing a real desire to reach an agreement, as wished for by Secretary Root, but Canada wanted not so much monetary compensation for anything she may have to give up. The questions to be settled include pelagic sealing, the lake fisheries, the Canadian sea fisheries, the diversion of water power from the St. Lawrence and the diversion from the boundary rivers.
