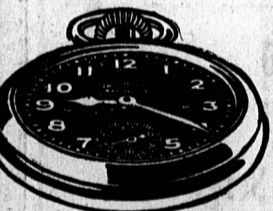
United Farmers Have Stormy Session

MONCTON, Sept. 29.—At a largely attended but rather stormy convention held yesterday evening in the City Hall the United Farmers of Westshoreland County placed in the field for the forthcoming provincial election three candidates, also after a long and at times heated discussion, agreed to cooperate with the Independent Labor Party naming as fourth member ticket a member of Labor Unions.

Farmers Meet to Discuss Organization

At the request of a large number of prominent farmers in various parts of the province a series of meetings in the interests of the United Farmers of P. E. I. is being held for the purpose of organization. Mr. R. J. McMillan, one of the directors of the U.F.O. is addressing the meeting, assisted in organizing details by E. C. Hatch, of the United Farmer's Guide. To date, four meetings have been held on the western section of the province, the first one being at O'Leary on the evening of Sept. 21st. At this meeting the farmers of the locality voted unanimously to form a local branch of the United Farmers. A board of officers was elected, consisting of a President, Vice-President, Secretary and four directors. Similar action was taken at Ellerslie on the 22nd, Palmer Road, the 23rd and Kensington the 24th. Mr. McMillan in his address dealt with co-operation among the farmers in buying and selling their commodities and for political action.

In dealing with the co-operative work Mr. McMillan outlined the rapidly increasing business done by the U.F.O. They already own the second largest creamery in Ontario and are at present formulating plans to enlarge the capacity of their plant. The marketing of live stock is another line of their activities. During the first eight months they were doing business at the Union Stock Yards, Toronto, their turnover was over nine million dollars. They now have offices at the Montreal Stock yards and arrangements have been made with the U. F. of N. B. to market their livestock through the Ont. Association. Mr. McMillan states that the turnover this year in the U. F. O. co-operative work will be in the vicinity of \$30,000,000.

In dealing with the political side of the question he takes up the transacting of the affairs of Canada from a business standpoint and gives many apt illustrations of how the business of Canada is not looked after as it should be, showing the necessity for a change in the personnel of the government. Mr. McMillan comes from Huron Co., Ontario and is very active in the organization there, having been a farmer all his life. He is in an excellent position to speak on the need of organized effort among the farmers by virtue of his extensive travels in studying and selling of live stock having been seventeen times in Europe on this business besides numerous trips to Western Canada and the States.
