ADVENTURES OF DUNDEE WHAERR

St. John's Nfld., Oct. 22.—The whaling vessel, Ketch Snowdrop, which left Dundee, Scotland, April 9 for Baffin Land arrived here yesterday with but four of her original crew of four men on board, the remainder having returned home. These four men report an eventful summer on the coast of Greenland. The Snowdrop, which has auxiliary engines, struck a rock off the Greenland coast in June. She sustained serious injuries and became unseaworthy. Shortly afterwards the Danish steamer came along and took them to Dundee. The four other men stayed by the ketch and repaired her. They fished and trapped all through the summer, slowly working their way down here and trading with the Greenland natives along the coast. The ketch has travelled 2,000 miles between Dundee and this port.

CANNIBAL KING DINED ON ONEEN

MARSHALLS, France, Oct. 22.—The small advice, which reached here Wednesday from Indo-China, brought another and more revolting story of the doings of the King Than-Thai, showing that he went to the extent of cannibalism. After killing one of his wives, he caused the body to be cooked and served up for dinner, forcing his entourage to eat it under path of death. Some of the king's wives were bound and burned with boiling oil and subjected to other cruelty, while naked women were thrown into the cauldrons of wild beasts, where they were devoured before the king. Finally the French authorities made him a prisoner. He has been adjudged insane by Dr. Dumas, of the French colonial staff. The royal guard has been disbanded, the palace has been placed under the protection of one hundred and fifty native soldiers and the terror stricken inmates of the palace have been rescued from further sufferings. The majority of the latter were women, who bore the marks of revolting tortures. Some of them were terribly mutilated, their faces being slashed and tongues cut out, while others had been suspended by jinchors attached to the fleshy parts of their legs, to increase their agonies.

LONDON PEOPLE STARVE TO DEATH

LONDON, Oct. 22.—There were forty-eight cases in London last year in which a coroner's jury returned a verdict of "Death from starvation," or "Death accelerated by privation."

The cases are set forth in a home office return recently.

Of the total the eastern and north-eastern districts were responsible for no fewer than 22, there being 15 in the eastern district and 17 in the north-eastern district.

The most pathetic feature of the return is the fact that in most instances the victims of starvation suffered in silence and solitude. Probably from a feeling of pride, they did not ask for poor law relief, which might have saved their lives.

They starve rather than become paupers—or, as the official formula puts it, "the guardians had no previous knowledge of the case."

HERO REWARDED FOR LIFE SAVING

LONDON, Oct. 22.—At Southampton recently Mr. Hart, purser of the Union Castle liner Walmer Castle, was presented with the Royal Humane Society's medal and certificate for gallantry.

Mr. Hart, hearing the cry of "A man overboard," without a minute's hesitation or thought of danger, and without dressing himself of his clothes, sprang into a shark-infested sea near the equator at the imminent risk of losing his life.

A nasty sea was running at the time, and unfortunately Mr. Hart failed to effect the rescue, but Mr. Merriell's in making the presentation, said that fact in no way detracted from the bravery of the deed.
