PREMIER PARENT'S VICTORY.
 It now seems highly probable that in not opposing Premier Parent in an open and formal manner at the late provincial elections the Quebec Conservatives builded better than they knew. A square party opposition would have perhaps united and consolidated Parent's forces. As it is the party which he led has been divided and the Quebec Premier's much vaunted "victory" is one which may involve his retirement. The Montreal Witness, always friendly to all that is best in the Liberal party and policy, has this to say of the result in Quebec:
 "The result is believed of his best beloved. All those Liberals who were special by his candidates have been beaten. He had forgotten that it was a Liberal party of which he was the head, and thought to outstride it over the rank and file. Worse than that, he thought to substitute the party to the uses of schemes, and this in so barefaced a manner that it seemed only necessary to associate his name with a candidate to kill him. In Quebec East and West, where his influence hitherto has been most powerful, his candidates were defeated, as with the exception, perhaps, of Dr. LaCombe, were the Montreal candidates he specially delighted to honor. We congratulate the citizens of Montreal upon the general results, and especially upon the result in St. Louis Ward.
 "That result is a direct rebuff to the trusts, who will stand at Quebec for the next few years, but it is hope, sufficient honest men to defeat their schemes. Appearances and their schemes have been found out by the people and defeated. Mr. Parent's position is precarious one, and if the antagonism he has aroused among all independent minded Liberals is not in some way reversed it will doubtless result in his having to leave the Government. By his recalcitrance to the public interest he has certainly done a great thing for his party and for the country. For once the good element in a party has risen against the bad and driven it ignominiously forth and shown that it is possible for a party in Canada under the inspiration of high minded leaders to show virility enough to cleanse itself."
 The Witness is well informed regarding the internal workings of politics in Quebec, and always speaks with candor. Those who have the interest of the Dominion at heart cannot be without concern regarding the public affairs of the two great central Provinces, Quebec and Ontario where public affairs have been in a bad condition for years past. The Witness sees hope for Quebec in the result of the election just past. Let us hope that the coming election may do something to better the sad condition of affairs in Ontario.

HAY AND POLITICS.
TOLD BY COLOR.
Dr. Hooker's Experiments to Show Disposition by the "N"-Rays.
 The London Lancet publishes a letter from Dr. Hooker on the results of three years' experiment on the Blondlotz N-rays emitted by the human body. Dr. Hooker claims to have established the fact that these rays differ in color according to the character and temperament of a person, and also that the rays are not merely heat vibrations, as he proved by passing rays from his own hand to the forearm of a corpse to a prepared screen which immediately showed increased luminosity. In reference to the differing colors of the rays, Dr. Hooker says: "Rays emanating from a very passionate man have a deep red hue. One whose keynote in life is to be good and to do good throws off pink rays; an ambitious man emits orange rays; a deep thinker throws off deep blue; a lover of art and refined surroundings, yellow; an anxious, depressed person, gray; one who leads a debased life, muddy, brown rays; a devotional, good-minded, light green, and physically or mentally ill person, dark green rays."
 Dr. Hooker admits that his statement may be received at first with a smile of incredulity, but he is confident that it will sooner or later be accepted as a fact. He further claims to have proved that N-rays are not only given by the human body but by objects which have been in contact therewith. He obtained this impression from a letter 30 years ago, which proved that the rays were radio-active and retain their power on the paper on which writing is made.

Sir William Taylor's Retirement.
 The army will shortly lose the services of Sir William Taylor, K.C.B., whose period of appointment as Director-General of A.M.S., terminates early in December, says The British Medical Journal, which adds that he is authorized to contradict the statement that Sir Frederick Treves succeeded to the office. Sir William Taylor was born in 1843, the third son of the late Mr. James Taylor of Etruria, Staffordshire, and Moorfield, Ayrshire. He joined the Army Medical Staff in 1864, and served with distinction in Canada, India, Ashanti and Egypt, being present at the battle of Omdurman. He also witnessed the Chino-Japanese war as military-medical attache to the Japanese army. He was principal medical officer to the forces in India prior to his appointment as Director-General of the Army Medical Corps in 1901.
