Livestock Report

(Canadian Press)

MONTREAL, Dec. 20. - Live stock for sale on the two markets this morning amounted to 149 cattle, 477 lambs, 1,234 hogs and 363 calves.

The cattle were canners, cutters and a few bologna bulls.

The bulls sold for \$4.00 to \$5.25, and the canners \$3.00. Cutters were up to \$3.75. There were less than two dozen veal calves offered and they sold for \$11.00 to \$13.00 according to quality, grass calves brought \$5.25 to \$5.50.

There were no good lambs. Mixed lots of common lambs and bucks sold for \$10.50 to \$11.00 and \$11.50 was paid for a couple of better lots with a smaller percentage of bucks. Sheep sold from \$3.00 to \$5.50. Hogs were unchanged. Local butchers paid \$3.75 and \$4.90 on a flat basis and on one market, \$9.00 to \$9.12 was paid on a flat basis. Packers prices were \$8.75 for thick smooths, \$1.00 per hog bonus on selects and 50 cents per hog cut on shops and lights.

NEW C. N. R. STATION - The new C. N. R. station at Summerside was formally opened yesterday morning at 10.15 when Superintendent T. B. Grady on behalf of the management of the Canadian National Railway, formally presented the new \$23,000 depot to the town of Summerside, as a Xmas gift from Sir Henry Thornton and his staff. Mayor Frank Arlett presided over the meeting, which was rather informal and was representative of all the business interests of the town. Congratulatory speeches were made by A. E. MacLean, M. P., for Prince County, who showed that more than \$100,000 had been spent by the C. N. R. in Prince County during the last year by Senator MacArthur who pointed out that the Railway was owned by the people and that the public should take more interest in its operation, by L. B. Allen, M. L. A., Dr. John A. MacNeill, M. L. A., Ex-Mayor Campbell, Ex-Mayor Lidstone, J. Leroy Holman, G. M. Muttart, President of the Summerside Board of Trade, Maristrate J. E. Wyatt, K. C. and others. Supt. Grady, in formally opening the station, stated that more than \$10,000 had been spent by the C. N. R. in improvements to the railway properties in Summerside during 1928 as that amount had been officially passed in the estimates for the coming year. At the close of the meeting congratulatory telegrams were sent to Sir Henry Thornton, Hon. Charles Dunning and W. L. Appleton, Manager of the Atlantic Region, of the Canadian National, by the Mayor and Council of Summerside, the Summerside Board of Trade and by Mr. A. E. MacLean, M. P.

IN MEMORIAM

REV. WILLIAM PENNA

The death Monday morning, after an illness of twelve months, of Rev. William Penna at his residence 45 Cameron street, Moncton, removes from that city a great theologian, a deeply respected and prominent citizen.

Rev. Mr. Penna was born at New East, Cornwall, England at 1850 and was educated in the schools of his native town, and took private lessons in Theology.

He was received on probation to the ministry in 1873 in this country having arrived in Canada the year previous and his circuits included Charlottetown, Georgetown, Dalhousie, Upper Kent, Salisbury, Bayfield, St. David's, Apahagu, St. John (Charleton) Wesley Memorial, Moncton, Shediac, Milltown and Woodstock.

He was married on July 26, 1877 to Priscilla Emery at Montague, P. E. I. and she died in 1914.

On June 27, 1923 his many friends and ministerial associates presented him with a set of James Moffat's translations of the Scriptures and an address in honor of having reached his fiftieth year in the ministry.

He was financial secretary of the St. Stephen district and chairman of the Woodstock district. He is survived by his wife, one daughter, Mrs. J. T. Dunstan, at home, three brothers, Rev. Henry Penna, retired minister in Saint John and Jabez and Edwin in St. Louis, U. S. Two sisters, Mrs. Edwin Thompson at Marlehurst, Charlton County, and Mrs. William Edeyan of New York, widow of a Nova Scotia minister.
