PAPER HAS PUT AMERICAN OFFICIAL INTO DIFFICULTIES.

COLON, Sept. 11.—The "Star-Herald" editorially quotes Richard O. Marsh, the American charge d'affaires in Panama, as hinting that the United States will occupy and annex Panama if the Panama assembly ignores the wishes of the United States in the matter of the selection of a president of the republic.

It is openly stated that Marsh has in his possession a protest from many prominent Panamanians, members of the Conservative party, who claim that the assembly is illegally constituted. This protest, it is said, is not to be forwarded to Washington if Samuel Lewis, who is regarded as the choice of the United States, is elected president.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 11.—Instructions to promptly and publicly repudiate the interview he is alleged to have given at Panama have been cabled to Richard Marsh, the charge d'affaires by acting secretary of state Wilson.

GRAND TRUNK STRIKERS ANXIOUS

LONDON, Ont., September 12.—Alarm is felt among the former G.T.R. strikers over a statement made by a prominent official that no more passenger men are to be taken back. Supt Bowker, when asked, said: "If the men we have now continue to give the satisfaction they have been giving, and want to stay, there will be no place for old men." Asked regarding an arrangement to take the men back in 90 days, he said he knew of none, and thought it was a story concocted by the newspapers. Only seven passenger men out of a large number have been reinstated here.

ELECTRICIANS ELECT OFFICERS

ROCHESTER, N. Y., September 12.—With a brief business session this morning, the convention of International Municipal Electricians adjourned today, to meet in St Paul in 1911. These officers were elected: President, H. C. Bundy, Watertown; vice-presidents, J. B. Yeakle, Baltimore; James Craig, Toronto; secretary, Clarence George Houston, Texas; treasurer, C. E. Deale, Harrisburg, Pa. Harry G. Kennedy, of this city, was made chairman of the finance committee.

HOLDS SERVICES ON CHURCH STEPS.

NEW YORK, Sept. 11.—Locked out of St. Andrew's Protestant Episcopal church, Brooklyn, of which he had been a rector for sixteen years, the Rev. Wm. N. Aickley conducted the regular services today from the steps. Gathered around him, their heads uncovered and kneeling, were 300 members of the congregation who do not agree with the parish vestry that their pastor should be retired "because of his age and feeble condition, mental, and physical." Order was perfect throughout the services, but when the strains of the last hymn died away it was noticed that many in the congregation were weeping.

WILL RUN IN ENGLAND.

TORONTO, September 12.—Mike Ryan, of the Irish-American Athletic Club, who won the Spectorator Marathon at Hamilton last May 24, will sail for England next month to compete in the English Marathon, which will be held at Shepherd's Bush. He will represent Canada in the race, as the Hamilton Spectator is sending him over. He is going over at this early date in order to visit friends and relatives.

BIG TOMATO CROP.

LONDON, Ont., September 12.—The tomato crop in the district around London is one of the largest in several years and the catsnip factories will put down a lot of cutsup. Today the sales were going retail at six baskets for a dollar. There is a marked shortage of apples in Western Ontario, and the potato crop is none too good, even the famous Caradoc. All other vegetables, however, seem to be fairly plentiful.

MR MOWAT AGAIN PRESIDENT

TORONTO, September 12.—Despite the fact that he announced two days ago that he would give up the presidency, H. M. Mowat, K. C., was today again elected president of the Reform Association of Ontario. Hon. George P. Graham, who has just returned from his western trip, made a rousing speech.

SERIOUS EXPLOSION IN AMHERST.

AMHERST, Sept. 13.—This morning citizens of Amherst were aroused by terrific explosion which was followed immediately by the fire alarm. The fire workmen in the rolling mills of the Canadian Foundry there threw water on hot slare which caused the explosion. Russell Jones and a young man named Carter, were seriously if not fatally injured, the hot slag striking them in the face. Carter will at least lose his eye sight while both are considerably cut.

HALIFAX, Sept. 13.—Delegates from Halifax to Vancouver have arrived to attend the third annual convention of the Canadian Pharmaceutical Association which opens in the Technical College. An informal reception will be held for the visiting delegates.


