THE FIRE IN THE SPRINGHILL MINES

HALIFAX, Nov. 4.—The situation in the Springhill collieries has turned out to be more serious than was expected. The fire area in No. 3 mine is found to be a great and far advanced. The management and the government inspector of mines has decided that the fire can only be completely isolated and the rest of the mine rendered safe by sealing up the whole of the 2,000 foot level and all the working places on the 2,000 foot level.

The haulage plant, hoists, tools, and everything in this part of the mine have had to be abandoned. It is thought the loss of a very large body of coal, but the management decided to run no risks that might jeopardize their workmen.

The company will replace all lost tools and announce their intention within a few days, of placing every man at work in other sections of the mine.

It will take about two weeks to seal up the fire sections, which is done by building with brick walls. In the meantime the isolation has been made as complete as possible by the use of bands and canvas.

It may be years before the fire is extinguished by the setting up process. No. 2 mine, where a fire broke out two years ago was sealed and while the fire is blinding it is still in existence in that portion of the mine.

PASTOR'S WIFE MADE SENSATION

PITTSBURG, Pa., Nov. 5.—Rosa, the rodeo astride in the steeplechase races at the recent fashionable Sawtiekley Heights horse show, society has practically outstripped wealthy Mrs. Mahant Alexander, bride of a prominent pastor.

Her husband has not approved of the riding costume requiring the divided skirt and when Mrs. Alexander tried the innovation in the steeplechase the storm of criticism might not have been so terrific were it not for the fact that she is the wife of the pastor of the First Presbyterian church, the most fashionable congregation of the city.

Mrs. Alexander who this spring was Miss Madeline Euzelin, and inherited something like \$100,000 from her father, a pioneer in the steel industry, is an excellent horsewoman. She rode her own horse in the races. She could induce but one of her women to ride in the same kind of costume. This was a halcyon who has a large patronage among the wealthy women of Pittsburg, which fact added some fuel to the criticism. Mrs. Alexander won the race, but got the plaudits of only a few of her most loyal friends.

CLEVER ESCAPE FROM SIBERIA

ST. PETERSBURG, Nov. 4.—Gerschunin one of the most famous Terrorists and head of the fighting organization during the Sipiaguine and Von Plivhe regimes, has escaped from Siberia, concealed in a water tank. His disappearance is a serious matter to the police who lives the Terrorists are now seeking, as he is a skilled organizer and one of the most remarkable men the revolution has produced. Gerschunin, who is a Hebrew, was condemned to perpetual imprisonment for complicity in the assassination of M. Sipiaguine, late Minister of the Interior, and the attempt on the life of M. Pobedonostsev, former Procurator General of the Holy Synod. He was sent to the silver mines at Akhalai in the Mongolian frontier of Siberia, when the Schliassburg Fortress was closed as a prison for political offenders on February 13.

One of Gerschunin's comrades, a man named Melnikoff, escaped from the mine two months ago, and the Governor of Akhalai says he cannot guarantee the safe keeping of Sa-sanoff and Sikorsky, the other Terrorists implicated in the assassination of Von Plivhe, because the revolutionary agents who arranged the escape of Gerschunin and Melnikoff are lavishly supplied with money and have the sympathy of the whole population.

COUGHED UP A REBEL BUCKSHOT

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 5.—In a violent fit of coughing, shortly before a death at a local hospital, H. L. Mills, an Oregon pioneer of 1876, and nephew of General Robert E. Lee, yesterday raised from his lungs a buckshot that he had carried in his body since the civil war, when as a member of the 15th New York Engineers corps, he fought against the army commanded by his mother's brother.

JAMES W. KING BURNED TO DEATH

ST. JOHN, Nov. 4.—A fire which was probably of incendiary origin on Saturday night caused the death of James W. King, a well known commercial man, Maritime traveler for W. H. Thorne, and destroyed property to the value of about \$25,000. Mr. King lost his life in an effort to save the books from the office of his brother, which was badly gutted. He was overcome by smoke, and before he could be rescued was burned beyond recognition. The fire broke out almost simultaneously in the rear of W. E. and J. W. Meyers machine shop, and under the floor of William King's drug store, both on Waterloo Street, in the middle of a wooden block through which the flames made great headway. These two places and Ungar's Laundry, together with several small buildings were destroyed before the blaze was checked.

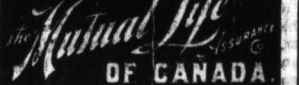
