CAPTAIN CRAIG ON TRANSPORTATION.—Captain T. J. Craig, who has been engaged on the mainland for the past two years, crossed on the Orwell yesterday and leaves for Orwell this afternoon. Asked for his opinion on our transportation problems, he replied as follows:—I notice a great change for the better since the P.E.I.R. has been standardized but there is still room for improvement as the Star Ferry, doing splendid work, is unable to clear the congestion in the busy season. For this reason the routes formerly operated by the Charlottetown Steam Navigation Co. should be reopened. I can safely say without any fear of contradiction that no other Provincial capital city in the whole Dominion has such limited communication with the outside world as Charlottetown. The seat of Government is certainly worthy of better treatment. Strangers coming to this province on a summer vacation returned to their homes thoroughly invigorated and much pleased with the general hospitality extended to them in all parts of the province. Many have given the Garden of the Gulf a new name—The Tourists Paradise—and claim that with better transportation facilities the population would soon exceed 100,000. The Trade returns show that the business of the province is advancing by leaps and bounds and in order to handle this extra business the extra population, must of necessity, be here to produce it. By all means let us have two car ferries on the routes between Charlottetown, Pictou and Summerside-Point du Chene reopened. Judicious advertising will bring the tourists and make both routes popular and profitable.

The ranch which he had charge of is recognized today as "the ranch" of Japan, not only for the quality of foxes shipped but the quality produced. In order to educate the Japs how to raise young foxes on cats, about such a contingency arise, Mr. Caswell took delivery of a litter of pups when a day old and demonstrated the practicability of it. This proved very successful and created a small sensation in its way and Mr. Caswell was looked upon as possessed of wonderful powers. The Japanese papers took the matter very seriously and had articles dealing with the fox business in general, dwelling on the great possibilities of the industry for Japan. Mr. Caswell relates some of the curious tales of Japan. One is never invited to a Japanese home but the hospitality is extended to Japanese tea houses where money is liberally spent and everything in the line of cats and drinks is accorded the guests. He received a very fine letter of recommendation from his employers and in recognition of his services received a number of splendid gifts including a very valuable Japanese sword, which signifies grateful friendship. He has been requested to return and is assured of the passage to this country. The scarcity of the animals is such that it was necessary to send 300 miles inland to secure them.

A TRIP TO JAPAN.—In reference to his recent trip to Japan where he went a year ago last November with a shipment of ten pairs of foxes from Rosebank Fur Farms, Ltd., Mr. John Caswell states, that he was treated royally by his Japanese employers and that his word was law insofar as taking charge of their ranch was concerned. Mr. Caswell found the climatic conditions in Japan about the same as Prince Edward Island at that time of year. The men assigned to the task of studying the business are men above the average in intelligence and they took a great interest in everything which Mr. Caswell showed them.
