THE MARKET PRICES.—The following prices were secured on the Charlottetown market square yesterday and have prevailed since last Friday.—White oats, 38 to 40c; black oats, 40 to 42c; potatoes, 25 to 30c; beef (quarter) per lb., 10 to 12c. The prices quoted by the wholesalers are—Potatoes, 25 to 28c; hay, 7c to 7.5c; white oats, 38c to 40c; black oats, 50 to 42c; straw, \$5.50 to \$6.50.

SPLENDID SALE.—B. Carter & Co. auctioneers, inform The Guardian that one of the best sales ever conducted in this Province was that of Wm. Chown's, Malpeque Road, three miles from Charlottetown, held last Thursday by Mr. Carter. Upwards of 500 people were in attendance and bidding was brisk with prices most satisfactory. The stock, crop and implements brought \$1800 while the horses sold from \$235 to \$162 each. Cattle brought equally good prices. John Roper paying \$160 for three milch cows, while other cattle sold from \$35 to \$60. Oats were sold at 57c a bushel, hay \$15 a ton, turnips 15c a bushel, potatoes 30c a bushel and other things in proportion.
