## Contract Bridge

Slips!

The defense in today's deal was good up to a certain point, but then it slipped a little!

East dealer, North-South vulnerable.

♠ 863	♠ K1007
♥ 1094	♥ 52
♦ K75	♦ AK32
♣ KJ42	♣ 963

The bidding:  
 East South West North  
 1 ♠ Double Pass 2 ♠  
 2 ♠ 2 NT Pass 3 ♦  
 Pass 3 NT Double Pass  
 Pass Pass

South was "brave" to stay in three notrump without anything resembling a heart stopper. West opened the spade eight, and East, correctly reading dealer for A-Q-J, played low so as not to give the enemy three spade tricks. South won with the queen, cashed the diamond ace, then led a second diamond. West ducked, and he did not fail to observe that his partner discarded a spade on the first diamond and a low club on the second.

Now, when South naturally persisted with the establishment of the diamond suit, West shifted correctly to a heart, but unfortunately for his own cause, his selection within the suit was not so correct! He led the ten. Dummy's jack covered; East won with the king and returned a club. South put in the queen, and West's king won. Now West led another heart — the nine, and after East had taken the trick, the eight in the closed hand was good. South now did not need two club tricks or three spades — he could count five diamonds, two spades, one heart and one club. West should have been more imaginative with his heart shift. His partner's discard signals had clearly discouraged spade and club leads, and therefore the heart shift was in order — but why the ten? South could not know that West had both the ten and nine of hearts; if West led a low heart, South could not conceivably risk the play of Dummy's seven-spot! He would have to fear the immediate run of the heart suit against him. Thus, he would have to play the jack or queen; and when West regained the lead in clubs, he could then play the heart ten through dummy and collect enough heart tricks to defeat the contract.
