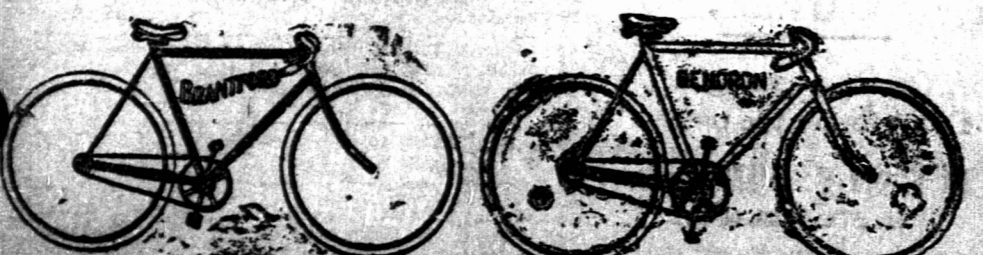

Building operations are apparently brisk in Winnipeg. So far this year 375 building permits have been issued and the new buildings will cost over a million dollars. This is about 25 per cent in advance the same portion of last year.

Two Chinese cannon are to be sent to Canada as trophies of the recent war in the east. They are of brass, weigh four hundred weight each and are 3.25 inch smooth-bore pieces, engraved with Chinese characters. They will be placed on Parliament Hill, Ottawa.

An Ottawa despatch tells that the census returns of Canadian cities and towns have been tabulated ready for publication, but will not be given out until Hon. Mr. Fisher returns. We hope that Mr. Fisher may come home without delay and not stop to play with other boys whom he may meet on the way. Our city "is small" as the esteemed Examiner is wont to say, but we want to know to a fraction just how many people it contains.

There is trouble over the will of the late millionaire Jacob S. Rogers, who apparently wanted to bequeath \$75,000 to a nephew and bestow the bulk of his estate on the New York Museum of Fine Arts. But a singular error in the will made the bequest to the nephew read "seventy-five thousand thousand dollars." This is more than the whole estate is worth, but the nephew naturally prefers \$75,000,000 to \$75,000 and some lawyers think he will get all there is. So says the Chicago Tribune.

Three new British battleships, of 16,500 tons each, are to be named respectively King Edward, Dominion and Commonwealth. Canadians and Australians will see in the new departure a recognition of the part they have recently taken in the defence of the Empire. When the Dominion is completed and placed in commission our people will feel a deep interest in her capability and in her future fortunes. It has been suggested that Canadians shall in some way mark their appreciation of the compliment paid them, in naming the new battleship. A service of plate of massive design ornamented with the maple-leaf has been mentioned as appropriate. In the American Republic battleships are named for States and the State in each case presents something to the ship in recognition of the honor.

It still costs pretty big money to send goods to Dawson City, notwithstanding the improved railway and steamer connection. The through rate from Vancouver or Victoria to Dawson is \$135 to \$290 per ton for shipments of under five tons. Shipments of over 500 tons each may go for \$95 to \$215 per ton according to class.

The crop outlook in the Maritime Provinces is at least an average one, in Quebec it is reported generally favorable, in Ontario good and in Manitoba and the Territories a record breaking crop is anticipated. They talk there of an average of 25 bushels to the acre. Even 20 bushels to the acre would give a total of over 40,000,000 bushels.

The Sydney Daily Post tells that in the rush from all quarters to Sydney within the past two years there have been many disappointments. "Nearly every line has been overdone. We have too many merchants; too many doctors; too many tailors, in fact too much of everything except capitalists. We have a good supply of the latter for which we are truly thankful, but a few more and a few more manufacturing concerns are what we need the most. Sydney is a big town; it is a growing town; it is a town with a future, but its future greatness will be marked by the financial corpses of many men who will regret that they ever came here. It is not the fault of the town, although the town is apt to get a set back on account of the failures; it is simply the inevitable result of overcrowding." The Post adds that there is no room in Sydney for a single additional business or professional man. The only room is for men of capital, or genius, or creators of enterprises.

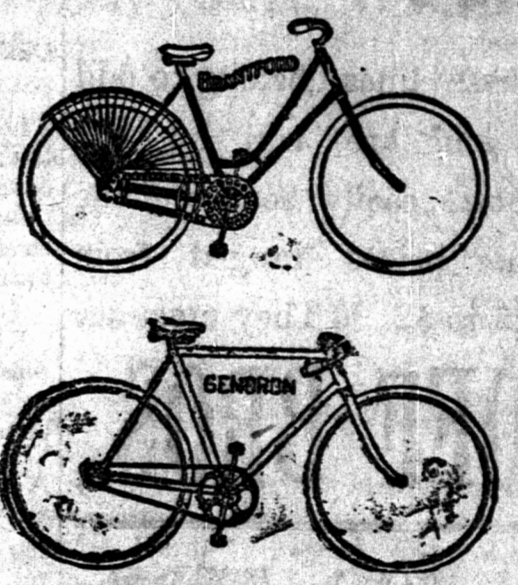
