ANNUAL MEETING I. O. G. TEMPLARS

In Dundas, Officers Chosen, Able Report on State of the Order.

(Continued)
V. We rejoice to know that the Legislature at its last session further amended and consolidated our Prohibitory Law and we trust that in the near future the present defects will be fully covered by further amendments.
VI. With regard to the inactivity of some of the inspectors we recommend that the attention of the Temperance Alliance be called to this matter.
VII. In the matter of Union Grand Lodge for Canada we recommend that this question be referred to a committee of the whole lodge.
VIII. Your Committee with the information at hand are not in a position to recommend that the Templar be adopted as our official organ but would recommend that if reasonable terms can be made with the publishers for the publication, in The Templar, of official notices of our Grand Lodge, circulars of our Grand Lodge officers, etc., the executive be empowered to guarantee for 36 copies of the paper for circulation among the Lodges in this Province and also that members be encouraged to subscribe for themselves.
IX. We recommend that a committee on by-laws be appointed to have referred to them the question of subordinate lodge by-laws mentioned in the report of the G. C. Templar, and the revising of the Grand Lodge by-laws and the price list of supplies mentioned in the report of the Grand Secretary, and that the Grand Secretary be a member of this committee.
X. We approve of the executive sending a delegate to the recent session of the G. Lodge of N. S., and feel sure that Bro. Bulphitt's visit will be of service to himself and credit to our Grand Lodge.
XI. We are pleased to note that eight Lodges responded to the appeal from Lodge, South Africa, and contributed \$251 toward the building of a Good Templar Institute.
XII. We would recommend that the master re-active and inactive members be referred to the committee on by-laws with the hope that the form of returns be put in keeping with the by-laws in this regard.
XIII. We are pleased to note by the report of G. Secy, that the recently organized lodges are being so well sustained and express the hope that they may not only long continue to maintain but also to largely increase their membership.
XIII. We commend the Executive for carrying out the desire of the Grand Lodge memorial of our late Bro. Fraser and are pleased to learn that the memorial cards have given good satisfaction.
The report was taken up clause by clause and after full discussion was adopted as a whole.

Report of Committee on Juvenile work. To the G. C. T. and officers of the Grand Lodge.
Your committee on juvenile work after having examined the report of the G. S. J. W. to be reported as follows:
I. We are glad to see that the G. S. J. W. has been active during the past year and one new Temple has been organized.
II. We approve of the action of the G. S. J. W. in writing to the Lodges urging them to try and organize a Temple wherever possible and if not to act in accordance Act 8 sec. 9 of G. I. by law also to carry out the resolution passed by G. Lodge last year.
III. We would recommend that some steps be taken to enforce the law prohibiting the sale of cigars, cigarettes and tobacco to minors.
IV. We recommend that some special effort be made during the year to organize new Temples in connection with as many subordinate lodges as possible.

Whereas, in the opinion of this Grand Lodge the Prosecutors under the Provincial Prohibitory Act in the County of Kings are far from being as active in the discharge of their duties as the importance of the work demands, and
Whereas, it is also the opinion of this Grand Lodge that the salaries of these officials are so small that competent men cannot be secured to carry on the work in a satisfactory manner;
Therefore Resolved through the medium of the Kings County Temperance Alliance, or otherwise the matter of increasing the salary of the said Prosecutor be brought to the attention of the Government, and
Further Resolved that the present Prosecutors be required to devote themselves more diligently to their duties or be replaced by more active workers.

LONDON, Aug. 7.—Reports received in London of the remarkable achievements of John Floetinn, the boy clairvoyant of Christiania, have aroused great interest in the case. He has just discovered the body of a man who disappeared a fortnight ago, leaving no trace of his whereabouts. A photograph of the missing man was shown to the boy. Covering his eyes, he drew a diagram of the course the man had taken in the woods. At a point indicated the man's handkerchief was found. The day afterwards, the boy himself was taken over the course followed by thousands of curious sightseers. He suddenly stopped and said he could see quite plainly where the body lay. He asked that a boat be rowed to a point in the river and said, "Here he is." The body was found at the bottom of the river at the exact point indicated. His powers were discovered three months ago. He is now the most talked of person in Norway.

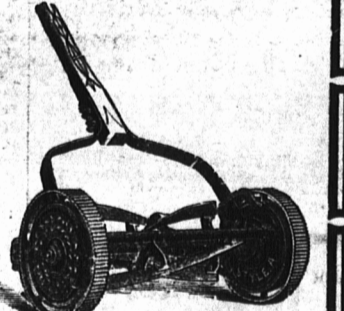

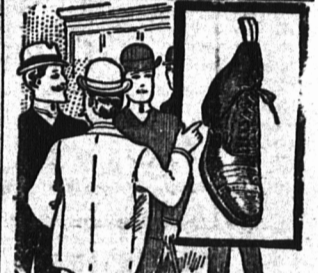

Synopsis of Canadian North-West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, excepting 3 and 4, not reserved, may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section acres, more or less.
Entry must be made, personally at the local and office for the district in which the land is situated.
The homesteader is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans:
(1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.
(2) If the father, for mother, if the father is deceased, of the homesteader resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for the requirements of residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.
(3) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.
Six months' notice in writing should be given this Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of intention to apply for patent.
