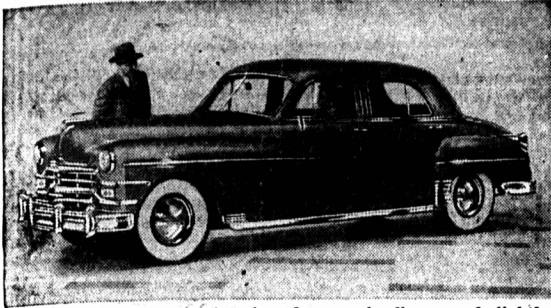


New Chrysler Now on Display



Increased vision, roomier interiors, longer wheelbases, and slightly smaller outside dimensions are some of the features of the new Chrysler models.

Wider seats for increased comfort, more streamlined appearance, many new safety features and Chrysler-engineered mechanical improvements, all combine to make the new Chrysler "the greatest Chrysler in history in every way,"

of the steering wheel. The area of the rear window has also been increased. Forty-four percent greater windshield area is swept by new wipers for safer driving in bad weather.

Increased passenger comfort, improved windshield defrosting and more effective removal of window fog are made possible by the redesigned fresh-air car heater, available in production at extra cost.

New door design and new door fitting along with new weather stripping and a 1/8" coating on the top side of the body floor all combine to minimize dust annoyance to the occupants of these new cars.

Greater steering ease is featured in the new Chrysler, accomplished by an entirely new centre-steering system. A higher steering ratio between steering wheel and front wheels and final equal length tie rods to each wheel are important factors in the new system, which make it possible to steer with much less effort.

Improved efficient Chrysler braking system is maintained, and features two-cylinder front brakes. Parking brake action is made easier and more positive by the use of a double pawl lever to permit easier setting and releasing.

Modifications to the L-Head Chrysler engine give quieter, smoother operation. The new air cleaner has a larger silencer volume, tuned to the engine, for increased quietness in engine operation.

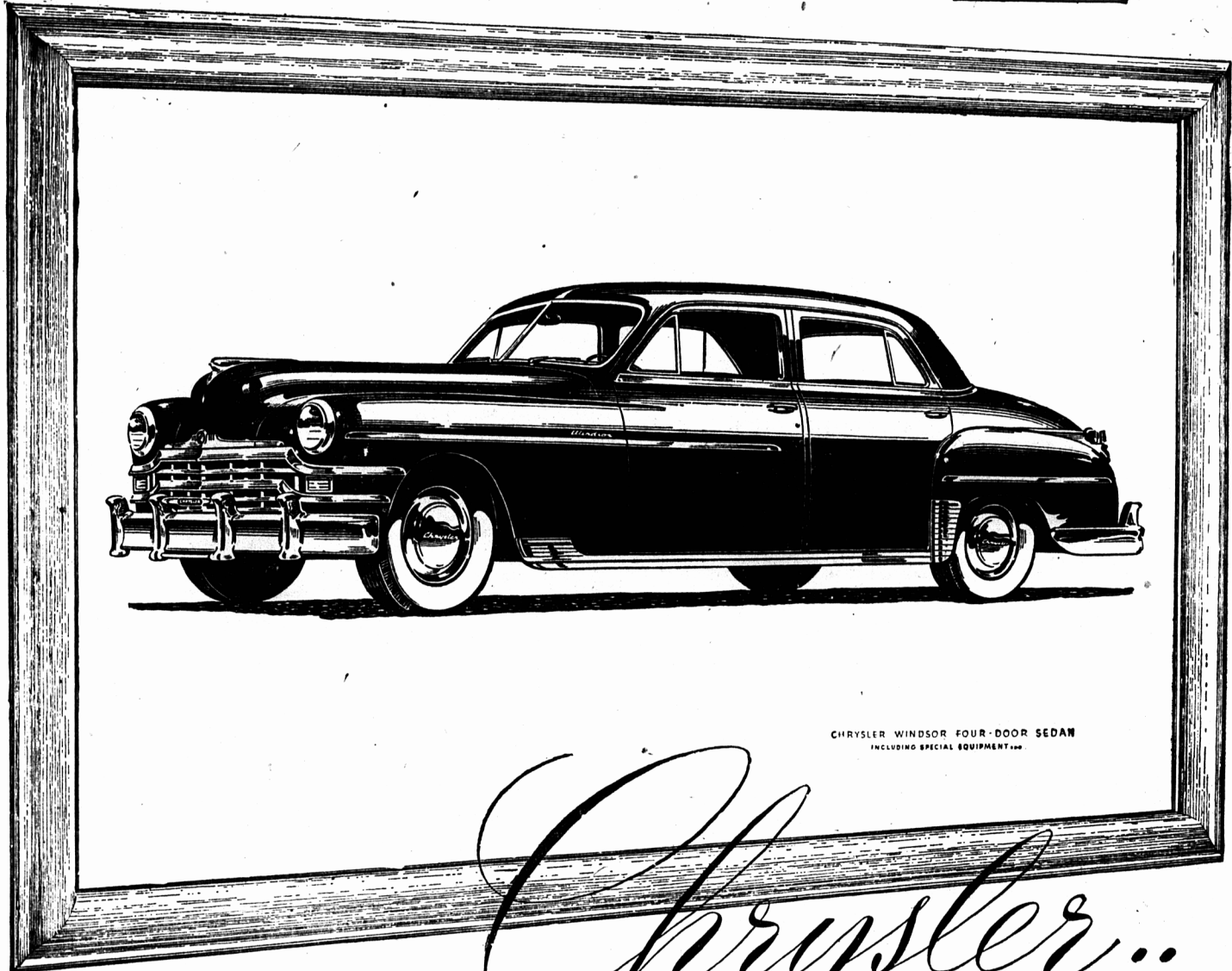
Rear doors are now swung from a reinforced "B" post to provide easier access to seats. All doors are hinged from the forward edge to minimize chances of accidental opening.

The four extra inches of wheelbase permit passengers to be seated further forward of the rear axle for greater comfort, without sacrifice of head and leg room. In addition, a lowering of the frame side rails in the centre provides Chrysler passengers with the comfort of chair-height seats—up to 3 1/2 inches higher than competitive models.

The new car's front compartment features a single glare-proof housing for panel instruments and a panel that curves to give more arm room and knee room for the front seat passengers.

DRINKING CHIEF CAUSE OF CRIME

For the second time in succession the opening of Supreme Court in Queen's County was marked recently by the presentation of a pair of white gloves to Chief Justice Thane A. Campbell as an indication, in the words of the Chief Justice, "of the comparative absence of any serious crime in Queen's County."

"I say comparative absence," the Chief Justice said in his address to the Grand Jury, "because my comments on less serious crime cannot be so complimentary. 41 cases tried by the Magistrates have been appealed to this Court. 37 of them have to do with the unlawful use of intoxicating liquor. A good proportion of the other appeals have

something to do with the unlawful use of liquor. Of the 342 prisoners during the past six months may be traced directly or indirectly to the unlawful use of intoxicating liquor.

"I have no doubt the large number of arrests is due to the vigilance of the law officers and that were it not for their strict attention to duty, many of those convicted on those lesser crimes might have gone on to commit more serious ones. I don't know whether or not you gentlemen can do anything about it. We have a new Temperance Act on the statute books and there

is no excuse for this unlawful traffic in intoxicants." —P. E. I.
