THE ISLANDER WRECK LOCATED. NEW YORK, July 16—(Special)—Capt. Finch, Manager of the Union Salvage Co. of Tacoma, has located the wreck of the steamer Islander, sunk three years ago when coming from Klondyke.

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RUSSIANS SEIZE BRITISH STEAMER

Stop a German Steamer and Get Many Sacks of Japanese Mail—Japan's Official Denial of Losses Before Port Arthur.

A HIGHHANDED ACT. ADMIRALTY, July 16—(Special)—The North German Lloyd's steamer Prinz Heinrich was stopped by a Russian volunteer steamer and compelled to give up thirty-one sacks of Japanese mail.

A BRITISH STEAMER SEIZED. It is said the British Peninsular and Oriental steamer Malacca from Antwerp for Japan has also been seized in the Red Sea.

JAPAN'S OFFICIAL DENIAL. LONDON, July 16—(Special)—Japan gives an official denial to the Russian story of Japanese loss at Port Arthur and declares that there was not a gun fired on the date in question.

TURNING THE RUSSIAN LEFT. The main body of General Oku's forces seems to be swinging around the Russian left after having combined with General Nodsu's army.

ALSO THE RUSSIAN RIGHT. The Japanese are also moving up the coast on the Russian right.

RUSSIAN VIEW OF THE CASE. Russian official sources while without news, decline to accept the Japanese denials and believe the Port Arthur attacking force has received a severe check.

[The Russians stopping a German steamer and seizing a British mail steamer in the Red Sea looks like a

rather audacious proceeding, but comes apparently within the rights of a belligerent in war. The real remedy is for Japan to send a cruiser to the Red Sea and put the Russian out of action. Japan's official denial of the reported battle and defeat with heavy Japanese losses before Port Arthur may be accepted as true. The Japanese know what occurred the Russian outside of Port Arthur cannot possibly know. If both parties had equal knowledge the Japanese account would probably be more reliable than the Russians. So far the Japanese appear to have given a faithful account of their successes and reverses alike, modest in victory and truthful in regard to losses. The encircling movement of Oku and Nodsu around the Russian right and left is no doubt preparatory to driving the Russians further backward up the railway line, with the early capture of New Chwang as a probable result. Since General Oku has gone northward General Nogi has been in charge of the army besieging Port Arthur. We have heard little of General Nogi so far, but it may be remarked that he is one of ten Japanese commanders holding the full rank of General. He was promoted to this rank after the battle of Nan Shau Hill. He was also in command of one of the divisions that captured Port Arthur in the war with China ten years ago. There is much guessing as to the present strength of the his command. Chinese and Russian estimates vary between 30,000 and 60,000 men.]
