SCHOOL BOARD MEETING—The monthly meeting of the City School Board was held yesterday afternoon in the office of the secretary Mr. T. E. McNutt. Mr. L. E. Shaw, trustee officer, and the three principals were present to discuss the matter of truancy in the city schools. After the various phases of the subject had been presented it was felt that there were very few cases of actual truancy in the city and that the official is performing his duties very satisfactorily. The resignation of Miss Eleanor F. Webster of West Kent School, was accepted, the resignation becoming effective on April 30, and the application of Miss Helen B. Farquharson, city, to fill the vacancy, thus formed, was accepted. On account of the Teachers' Convention taking place from April 15 to 17 it was decided to close the schools for the Easter holidays at 3 o'clock Monday, April 14, and reopen at 9 a. m. Tuesday, April 22.

S. S. HILLSBORO—The good ship Hillsboro has been waiting in readiness for the past few days with a full head of steam, and when the harbour is clear of ice service will begin. The boat looks fresh and clean with a good coat of paint inside and out. The engine has been gone over and is all shining as only Mr. Bridges, the engineer, would have it. All the bearings have been snugged up and the machine now runs perfectly. The boiler room has been painted and there is not the sign of steam hissing or leaking. The outside work and general appearance of the boat on deck reflects credit on Mr. Lane who looks after this part at present while Capt. McDougall is absent through injury, having hurt his hip in a severe fall, he is however beginning to move out again and by the time the ferry starts he will be at the wheel again. All will be glad when a sail to Rocky Point will once more be possible. Some repairs are being done to the wharf and two first class floats are being built. This branch of the government service is being well looked after by competent men.

LIVESTOCK MARKET
(Canadian Press)
MONTREAL, Livestock—April 7.—Cattle receipts on the two Montreal livestock markets today totalled 964. cents or more lower. Good cattle were the first to sell. One car lot of good steers brought \$11 and a few

smaller lots picked out brought \$10-75. Just medium steers brought around \$10 and common thin steers down to \$8. Several lots of plain steers brought \$9 to \$9.75. Good cows were slow sellers at \$7.75 to \$8.50. Bulls sold from \$5 to \$8.75 with an odd choice bull a shade higher.

Quotations—Butcher steers good \$10.50 to \$11, medium \$9.75 to \$10.25, common \$8 to \$9.75, butcher heifers good \$10, medium \$8.50 to \$9.50, common \$7.00 to \$8.25, butcher cows good \$7.75 to \$8.50, medium 5.50 to \$7.50. Canners, \$3 to \$4, cutters \$4.25 to \$4.75, butcher bulls, good \$7.50 to \$8.50, to \$8.75, common \$5 to \$7.50.

Calf receipts were 1106. The calf market was about steady. Trade opened slow. Good veal were in demand for Easter's trade. Good veal calves averaging between 115 and 120 lbs made \$9 common to medium quality veal were from \$7.50 to \$8.50. Very common veal or pail fed calves sold as low as \$6. Grass calves were common and brought \$4 to \$5.

Quotations, good veal \$8.75 to \$9, medium \$7.50 to \$8.50, common \$6 to \$7.50, grass \$4 to \$5.

Sheep receipts were 60. The sheep market was steady. Sheep were steady at \$7 to \$8, including a few yearlings.

Quotations, ewes \$7 to \$8, lambs good \$8, hog receipts were 2,212. Hogs were unsettled and uneven in quality. Prices ranged from \$13 to \$13.50 fed and watered. Sixty percent of the hogs were not sold early today. Sows brought from \$11 to \$11.75.

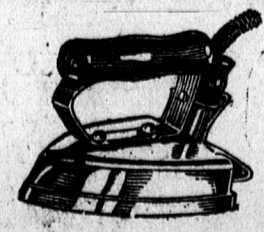
