When he was consulted, as Bishop of Durham, by George II. as to the fittest person to fill the vacant archiepiscopal see of York he replied: "Sir, hadst thou faith as a grain of mustard seed thou wouldst say to this Mountain (dramatically striking his breast), "Be thou removed and cast into this sea (see)." That George II. should so understand and appreciate the joke as to accept his suggestion is perhaps the strangest part of the story.

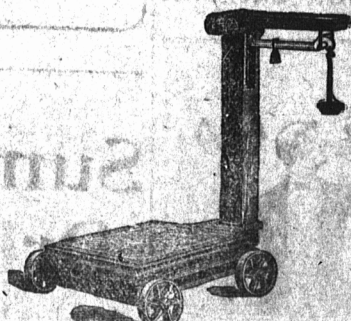
