THE Manitoba Free Press says:—The new Salvation Army hall was formerly opened Friday evening by Commissioner Eva Booth, the auditorium being packed by an audience of at least 1,000, and very many were unable to gain admittance. The chair was occupied by Attorney-General Campbell, and upon the platform besides the commissioner were His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor, J. H. Ashdown Major Southall, well known in Charlottetown, and other prominent officers of the Army. The attorney-general, the lieutenant-governor, and Mr. Ashdown all spoke, complimenting the army on the good work being accomplished and wishing them success for the future. The commissioner spoke for nearly half an hour, giving an excellent resume of the work of the Army in all its phases. Major Southall gave an outline of the financial position and the methods of holding the Army property. The new hall is situated on Rupert street and is a handsome brick structure erected at a cost of \$18,000, of which \$7,000 has been raised by the local corps. The building contains an auditorium with a seating capacity of 750, also a smaller hall for the weekly meetings and Sunday School, which will seat 300. The offices of the provincial headquarters, also rooms for the cadets in the training school are all nicely fitted up, the building being heated throughout by hot air. Besides the receipts at the door which must have been considerable, the sum of \$270 was subscribed towards the building fund. Mr. J. H. Ashdown donating \$100.

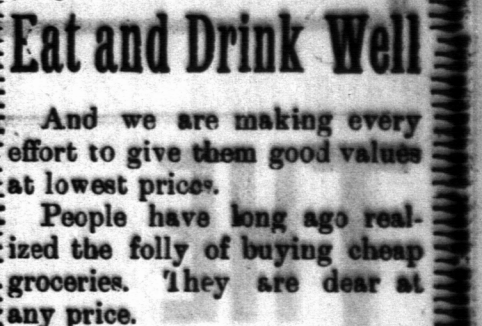
