THE bridge, spanning the head of Lord's mill-dam, North Tryon, has been repaired. The old foundation braces have been replaced by arched braces, and new sills and covering have taken the place of the old. The work was creditably done by Messrs. Creamer & Sons. This bridge is now second to none of its kind on the Island and too much credit cannot be given Hon. S. E. Reid, for his energy in getting it repaired.

A VALUABLE horse, owned by Thomas Dawson of North Tryon, was severely cut in a barb-wire fence on the 9th inst. In some unknown way, the horse became entangled in the wire and next morning, when the animal was found, the right hind leg was almost severed at the hook joint. The leaders and cords were completely severed and the metatarsal was broken and shattered. Dr. James McDonald, of Summerside, was at once summoned and did all in his power for the relief of the animal, but the V. S. thinks the animal will have to be shot.

THE S. S. Polino, Capt. LeChance, arrived here at 4 p.m. yesterday from Montreal, after having called at Summerside, Charlottetown, and "the Sydneys." She had a good passage down and brought two-thirds general cargo, a number of cattle and sheep on deck, and as passengers, Messrs. Hackett, Garneau and Miss Warren. She sails again at 8 o'clock tonight, taking as outward passengers, Miss Harding to Montreal, Mrs. and Miss Williams to Sydney, and three in steerage for the former and two for the latter port.—St. John's Telegram 5th.

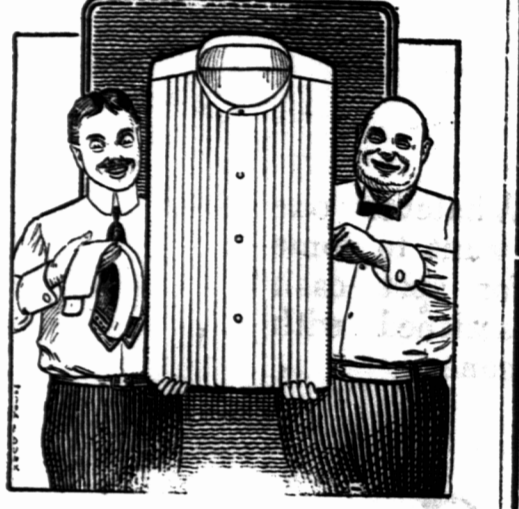
