GREAT PIPE LINE TO THE BRITISH FORCE

LONDON, Dec. 17 - Major General P. B. Maurice, Chief Director of Military Operations at the British War Office in a talk with the Associated Press outlined the campaign that resulted in the fall of Jerusalem.

"Gen. Allenby entered Jerusalem Tuesday," said General Maurice. "The campaign which led to this has been carried out mainly by British Imperial troops, supported mainly by troops of Australian and New Zealand mounted men and British yeomanry."

"Every ounce of material for the pipe line and the railroad came either from Great Britain or the United States."

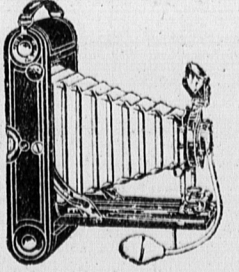
