## To interview Every man of Military age

TORONTO, Oct. 9—(CP)—Maj. L. E. Sharpe, recruiting officer for Military District No. 2, said today that every man in the district between the ages of 18-2 and 45, whether or not he has been rejected for military service, will be interviewed by a recruiting officer. "This is not a high-pressure affair to bulldoze or shame men into joining the army," Maj. Sharpe said, "but we are anxious to make sure that every man knows everything we can tell him about joining the army." "We still have a voluntary recruiting system in Canada and every individual has the right to say if he wishes to come in. We feel that if people know the full facts they will offer their services. They haven't got the complete story. Our recruiting officers are not going to arm and sway you to that of recruiting sergeants in Saskatchewan. (An announcement from Regina last night said men would be interviewed personally throughout the province.)

## Abandon plan to Build tankers

NEW YORK, Oct. 9—(AP)—Standard Oil Co. (N.J.) announced today that it will abandon its plan to build 36 new tankers to relieve the threatened east coast oil shortage. The company decided it was going ahead with the project. "The companies concerned were listed as Cities Service, Consolidated Oil, Gulf Oil, Pan American Petroleum and Transport, Shell Union, Esso-Vacuum, Atlantic Refining, Texas, Tide Water Associated, Sun and Standard Oil (N.J.)." "The companies have been notified that it is the U. S. Maritime Commission's view that there will not be available the steel, machinery or skilled labor for the new yards and that if they were to be undertaken it might be at the expense of the program being carried on through existing yards," the announcement said.

## Zealous Guard Halts Duke of Windsor He Had No Pass

HIGH RIVER, Alta., Oct. 9—(CP)—The Duke of Windsor on the first lap of his return journey to the Bahamas after a 10-day vacation on his "EP" ranch in the Alberta foothills paused for an hour today at the No. 5 elementary training school of the Royal Canadian Air Force.

After inspecting the field and buildings, meeting members of the personnel in charge the Duke left for Calgary.

Arriving at the gates of the High River school a little earlier than he was expected, the Duke learned that Air Force regulations are no respecter of persons. An over-zealous guard refused to admit him without a pass.

"I'm the Duke of Windsor," His Royal Highness said when the guard asked to see a pass. Professor W. L. Carlyle, "EP" ranch manager who was with the Duke, offered assurances but the guard was still skeptical and was endeavoring to have the car parked in the parking enclosure outside the depot gates when the Duke was hurriedly rescued.

**OAT BREAD**  
Half lb fine oatmeal; 1-2 lb white flour; pinch of salt; 1-2 oz yeast; 1-2 oz sugar. Mix the sugar in a cup of hot water. Now add the yeast and a handful of oatmeal.

Mix well and stir out all lumps. Work the oatmeal, white flour and salt together in a dining bowl. Make a well in the centre of the flour, then pour in the yeast. Place a cover over the bowl and stand in a warm place for about twenty minutes. Now mix all together and form into a stiff dough. Now set aside again for an hour in a warm place. Knead the dough again, then place in baking tins, half-filling them. Put into a hot oven and bake quickly.

## Movie Comedienne Weeps In Court Over Busted Romance

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 9—(AP)—Movie comedienne Judy Canova wept in court today, told a tale of shattered romance after a whirlwind courtship under a Honolulu moon and won annulment of her marriage to James H. Ripley a former United States army corporal.

All in black—black dress, black hat, black shoes, black stockings, black purse—the actress testified she said he was doing accounting for the government—that he had been sent to Hawaii on a difficult matter—a sort of secret service matter for the government.

The actress said she did not know Ripley was in the army—on the marriage licence application he wrote that he was not in the service—and discovered he was absent without leave only when an army officer burst into her bridal suite
