### PHOENIX PARK TRAGEDY RECALLED.

DUBLIN, Sept. 9.—James Fitzharris, better known by the name of "Skin the Goat," who drove the cab containing the assassins of Lord Frederick Cavendish, chief secretary for Ireland, and T. H. Burke, the permanent under secretary, to the scene of the crime in Phoenix Park, May 6, 1882, died Wednesday in the workhouse.

Fitzharris was released in 1903 after serving 20 years of a life sentence for his share in the tragedy.

### MAN DROWNED WHILE SAVING GIRL'S LIFE.

NEW LONDON, Conn., Sept. 9.—In trying to rescue Barbara Loomis from drowning at Ocean Beach, Jas. Brennan lost his life. The girl had gotten beyond her depth and when Brennan attempted to save her she clasped him so tightly about the neck that he could not breathe and both went down. A man in a canoe saved the girl, but Brennan could not be revived when brought ashore.

### FINDS COMFORT IN THE DECISION.

BOSTON, Sept. 9.—The opinion that the United States has been worsted in the fisheries dispute was disputed yesterday by Congressman August F. Gardner. He represents the Gloucester district in congress and, with his father-in-law, Senator Henry Cabot Lodge, handled the case of the Gloucester fishermen at Washington. In an interview on the local bearings of the decision at The Hague, Congressman Gardner discussed the principal effects on New England fishing and pronounced them to be of little or no disadvantage, while certain obvious advantages have been gained by having the dispute at an end.

"The original dispute arose over the right of the New England fishermen to engage in the herring fisheries. While the subject was being threshed out it was merely thought best to settle what was to be considered the three-mile limit, whether a line following the configuration of the shore, or a line from the outer ends of the headlands. England has won."

"This may conceivably some day inconvenience the Gloucester fishermen, but for the present it need cause them little disturbance. So far as practical purposes, the decision under point five changes nothing. It is the farthest from a 'death blow' to our herring fisheries as announcements yesterday stated, and anyone the least conversant with the facts now readily sees this, though the three mile limit decision may affect the mackerel fishing."

"The real menace to Gloucester's share in the herring fisheries was a point in point 2, and this was decided in our favor. Sir Robert Bond knew that for gill netting a crew of fifty men was wanted. If a Gloucester schooner were to bring the whole fifty it would raise the price of herring to a figure where no one could buy. The Newfoundland Premier therefore attempted to prohibit New-England vessels from shipping Newfoundlanders to make up their crews. If he had prevailed at The Hague our fishermen would have had a serious reverse. Our contention was that the flag vessel carries covers the whole crew, and that it would be obviously unjust to demand a whole Yankee crew on a Yankee schooner, as a whole British crew on a steamer flying the British colors. We were sustained in this very important point."

Newfoundland has received the right to make local regulations regarding the fisheries. As a matter of fact it is highly desirable and necessary that Newfoundland should have this power to prevent abuses of the fishing privileges such as dynamising, the disposal of gurry and refuse, and the like—since it is surrounded by a safeguard for us. For although Newfoundland may make local regulations governing United States fishermen, these regulations are subject to the approval of an impartial tribunal in case our fishermen desire to protest. In the future the Newfoundland Government attempts to enforce regulations that will work us hardship, we may be sure that an impartial commission will relieve us of this hardship."

### HUSBAND PAID JILTED LOVER'S EXPENSES.

GLACE BAY, Sept. 9.—The Gazette says: A breach of promise case that promised some very interesting developments, came to light a day or two ago, but the matter will, it is understood, never be given to the public through the medium courts as the trouble has been amicably settled, without the intervention of the law.

The facts in connection with the case are as follows: A young man employed in No. 2 colliery had become engaged to a young lady residing in the main part of the town. The wedding day was set for the latter part of July, and the young man was happy and contented in furnishing up the new home. In the meantime a stranger appeared on the scene, and began making love to the intended bride. The evening before the day set for the wedding, the new lover stole a march on his rival, and carrying the girl off to a neighboring town, they were married after some difficulty.

The groom-to-be had spent considerable sums of money in making preparations for the wedding and furnishing a new home. Feeling sore over being jilted he desired revenge.

The jilted lover entered proceedings against his former sweetheart, for the recovery of the amount of money he had spent upon her, and in furnishing their proposed new home.

Rather than have the matter come before the courts with all the publicity that would ensue, the husband of the girl has agreed to refund the money. Now everybody is happy and contented as circumstances will allow over the outcome, as the jilted one says he is well clear of a girl like that, he will get his money back, and the bride and groom are happy in the possession of each other.

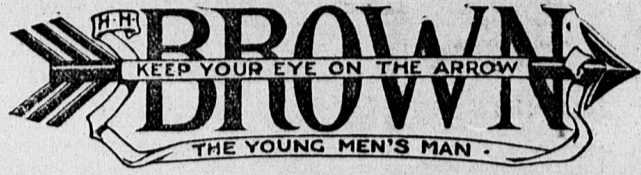

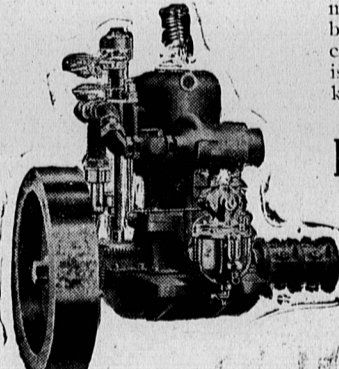
