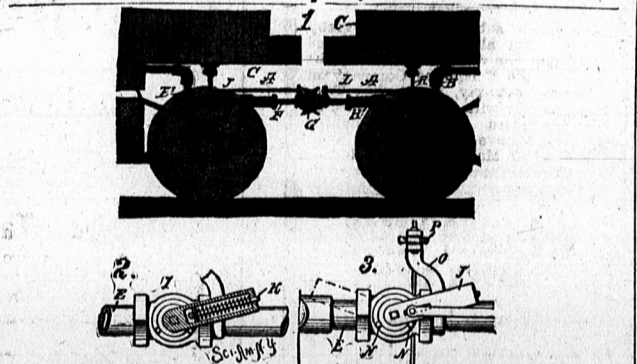

AUTOMATIC COUPLER FOR AIR-BRAKE PIPES.
 Pictured in the accompanying engraving is an improved coupler arranged to automatically connect the air-break pipes of railroad cars while in the act of coupling the cars, to form a continuous passage for the flow of compressed air from one car to another without danger of leakage. The apparatus also comprises means for closing the air-break pipes whenever desired, as when making up a train.
 FEATURES OF THE AUTOMATIC PIPE COUPLER
 (1) Being all metallic, excepting ends having flexible cushions when coming together, so ends are air tight.
 (2) Can stand unlimited pressure where the present hand hose coupler can't stand over 70 pounds of air pressure.
 (3) Saving expense of replacing the weather worn hand hose which costs over a million dollars yearly.
 (4) The new device will cutlive the life of any car attached to.
 (5) Trainsmen stand no chances going between the cars at the risk of their lives.
 (6) Cars going around direct curve without changing position of automatic device.
 (7) Lever "J" has increased spring to take up excess play in the draw bar.
 (8) D is a stationary jack with perpendicular and lateral spring increased to overcome the irregular motion of the cars.
 (9) B is air pipe from main air reservoir with swivel slide attachment of device on stationary jack D.
 (10) Thus making explained device placed stationary, always being direct in line and universal and standard on all cars.
