THE MUNICIPALITIES MEETING.

A number of Canadian mayors, aldermen, councillors and delegates from county and township municipalities are meeting in Halifax. The St. John Telegraph thinks the occasion might be turned to good account by the maritime delegates learning some economic lessons from the Western men whom they meet in the Convention. Among the matters on which the Telegraph thinks the eastern men might take valuable lessons would be by inquiring into the methods of western cities in attracting new manufacturing industries and new capital, how to pave streets, and dispose of garbage, together with their plan of assessment and of securing the best representatives at the council board.

Furthermore it is suggested that our eastern delegates inquire how Toronto gets its gas for 80 cents, and contrived to derive a revenue of \$40,000 for the citizens from the street railway during the month of July last. Then there is the question of electric power and light, with which Toronto, Winnipeg and other cities are now grappling with a prospect of utilising water powers a long distance away for this purpose. Possibly our western friends may learn something in the east as well but be that as it may our delegates will do well to learn all they can from the men who are foremost in the affairs of the larger and more populous centres of the west. Let us have light, even if it comes from the land of the setting sun.

THE LOBSTER INDUSTRY.

The lobster fishery perhaps is second only to our agriculture in its importance to the Island. The fear of its depletion and the means to its preservation are a perpetual industry have occupied much public attention from time to time. Yesterday The Guardian had a conversation with F. A. McCarthy of the Portland Packing Company on the subject. Mr. McCarthy, who lives in Tignish, is an Islander by birth and has been for years engaged in the lobster industry.

As to the better protection of the lobster fishery Mr. McCarthy thinks the existing laws are good and sufficient if properly carried out. It is true of laws as of forms of Government, "that which is best administered is best." He believes that we should look rather to the careful carrying out of the existing laws and regulations than to seeking for amendments.

As to the hatcheries, Mr. McCarthy is of opinion that instead of one there should be a dozen, at various points all around the Island, the good results from which would be apparent in four or five years after they had begun operations. Under natural conditions most of the lobster spawn is eaten up by various species of fish and but the merest fraction is ever hatched, and many of the infant lobsters are destroyed in the same way.

The lobster after his second or third year is well calculated to take care of himself against all comers. More hatcheries are what is wanted in Mr. McCarthy's opinion, to enable propagation to keep pace with the destruction that is constantly in progress. The present season has been a good one, and with better enforcement of the protective regulations, and more hatcheries, there is reason to hope that the lobster fishery may be made a perpetually productive and prosperous industry.

The Japanese appear to be quite as successful in raising warships from the seabottom as they were in sinking them. Togo's flagship, the Mikasa, sunk by an explosion after the war, affords the latest instance. This ship has been raised and in due time will be again in the fighting line. The raised Russian warships include four battleships, two cruisers, two gunboats and one destroyer, a total of about 55,000 tons. Six other warships were captured afloat during the war.

LONDON, Aug. 14. The valet is a disappearing type in England and wealthy men, except professed dandies, are to a great extent doing without the services of a body-servant.

The present liberal cabinet includes few men who employ valets, although one or two may be classed as "exquisites" and have a couple of men to attend to their personal appearance. In the House of Commons, which has now a great liberal majority and a strong labor party, the proportion of members who have valets is naturally very low.

Premier Campbell-Bannerman does not employ a valet and Arthur J. Balfour, the late premier, also dispenses with the services of a personal servant. His footman looks after his washbowl, and when that functionary is absent Mr. Balfour calls in the invaluable June, a retainer, who has been in the household for many years, to lay out his dress suit.

The decline of the "gentleman's gentleman" is a corollary of the decline of the French chief in aristocratic households, and a symptom of the economy that has become compulsory as a result of the South African war.

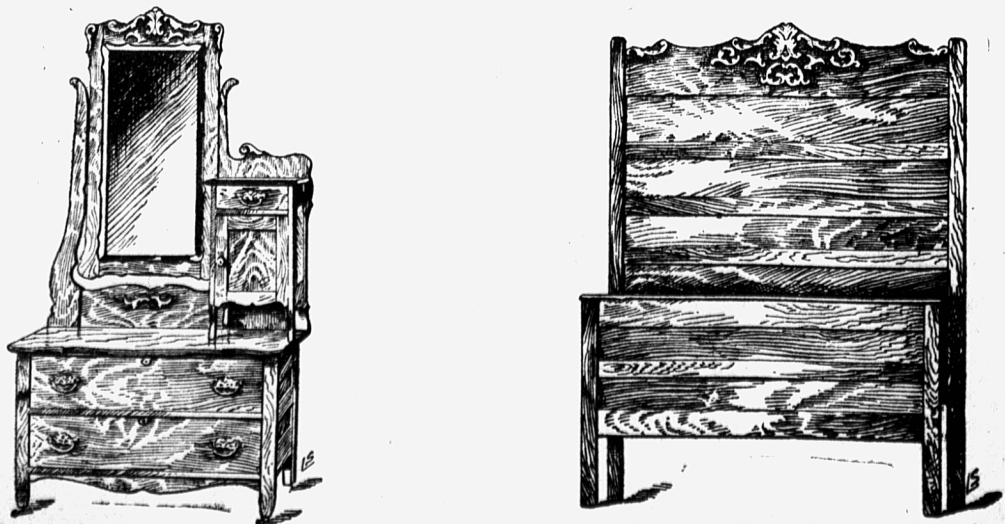
