SMUGGLERS' COVE, Calif. (AP) — An attempt by a five-man expedition to descend in a diving bell to the ocean floor, 6,000 feet below the surface of the Pacific, has been rescheduled for early tomorrow morning. The Boston scientist sent his five-foot steel sphere more than a mile below the surface again today with cameras and floodlights. It was the third preliminary exploration to test equipment.

TORONTO, Aug. 14 (CP) — James Cardinal McGuigan said Saturday that Toronto Catholics who read, write or distribute the Canadian Tribune or other Communist publications will be excluded from the sacraments and other blessings of the Catholic Church. His Eminence was commenting on the effect of the recent papal decree on Communism issued to Catholics throughout the world.

He pointed out that the decree is in two parts, one applying to professed Catholics who ally themselves in some way with practical Communism but do not adopt its basic materialistic principles; the other applying to those who profess Communist materialism and therefore deny the Catholic faith.
