

Japs Bore Toward Heart of China



Supported by mechanized units, Jap ground forces have made deepest westward penetration in the Sino-Chinese war to date, capturing positions in area south of the Yangtze river in drive toward Chungking.



Smack in the middle of Jap installations on Kiska Harbor lands an American bomb. U. S. warplanes from nearby Alaskan bases have blasted these buildings and an uncompleted airfield with raids averaging 100 a month. Continuously here since last June, Japs have had a year to dig in and fortify their positions.
