SCHOONER IN DANGER FROM ICE

(Canadian Press) WASHINGTON, Feb. 10.—A revenue cutter and the Roscoggin were ordered yesterday from the Main Coast to the Bay of Islands, Nfld., to rescue the Navy Tug Potomac. Officials think she is caught in the ice and with only a low power wireless apparatus cannot tell of her plight. She carried a crew of thirty-six men. (Canadian Press.)

GLOUCESTER, Feb. 10.—Local fish dealers who are familiar with

conditions of the Newfoundland Coast Express anxiety for the safety of the Potomac, which was last seen on February 5 dashing out of the Bay of Islands to escape being caught in the ice, after an unsuccessful attempt to rescue two imprisoned fishing schooners. They said the ice fields in the Gulf of St. Lawrence this season of the year is particularly menacing, and the swift tide of the Gulf frequently cause them to crash against one another with great force. It is believed the Potomac either sought shelter in some other harbour or is caught in one of the big floes. The Navy Department ten days ago gave the services of the Potomac to local dealers. At that time there were three schooners imprisoned in the ice in the Bay of Islands—the Riram Lowell of Buchport, and the Newfoundland Schooner, Frances Willard. Later word said that the Campbell had been driven ashore by the ice. All the schooners are loaded with frozen herring for local dealers. No great anxiety is felt for them as they are well protected.

A NEW FAD

(Canadian Press.) PARIS, Feb. 10.—Society has taken up another fad, the wearing of wigs of all colors by women at dances. The hair dressers of Paris are adopting a novel scheme for popularizing the latest fashion freak, color wigs. Four hundred manequins employed by the leading couturiers are to be provided with color wigs in which to appear at balls and music hall resorts of Montmartre and other rendezvous of gay Paris. 'It will probably be some time before color wigs are a part of woman's walking attire,' said a member of the Fashion Committee, 'but we expect to see them worn more and more in fashionable salons and at the theatre.' The price of the color wig is at present a bar to its success. Before a wig can be colored the hair must be bleached. The consequence is a pound of raw material costs \$100. The process of coloring is extremely delicate and makes for costliness. Only the wealthy will be able to afford a wig to match every fresh gown.

PARCEL POST

The Parcel Post System introduced into Canada by the Postmaster General, will go into operation on Tuesday the 10th inst. There is a special rate for parcels addressed to any place within a radius of 20 miles from the office of mailing, so that a parcel mailed to an office which is within the radius would be delivered to any person on a rural route which might happen to extend outside of the radius.

So far as this City is concerned the 20 mile radius will include all Queens County, except Lots 20 and 21 and that portion of Lot 67 adjoining Emerald and Springfield. It also includes practically the whole of Lot 62 and the south-eastern end of Lot 60, including Lewes, Caledonia, Culloden and Mount Vernon. But the radius will include as far east as West, St. Peter's, Morell Rear, Riverton, Lorne Valley, Head of Cardigan, New Perth West, Victoria Cross and Valleyfield and also a small portion of Prince County east of Tryon and North Tryon. The rate for any point in this radius is 5c. for the first pound, 6c. for two pounds, 7c. for three pounds and then 2c. a pound up to 11 pounds. This is an exceedingly cheap rate and no doubt the new system will be largely taken advantage of. The rates for other portions of Canada, are also very reasonable, and we understand that the Post Office Department are distributing cards showing the table of rates to the different Provinces. 1166m11
