

And should this tax be absolutely repealed when the Conservatives assume power again in a year or two his figures will be further confused.

Accounting for his breaches of faith to the teachers and others who interviewed him on public questions in his office he made the humiliating admission that he was without power or authority in his position; that the powers behind had him so bound "on tether" that he was in serfdom, dependent on their assent. The Government according to this are without an official mouthpiece, unless perchance they can get in touch with the hand that pulls the strings.
