Pitiable Waste Of British Man-Power

LONDON, Oct. 16.—"It is extremely unfortunate that the condition of England and of the English people and maliciously misrepresented in certain newspapers which circulate in Canada," says the Morning Post editorially, in commenting on the plans for increased Canadian immigration, announced by J. Bruce Walker, the new Dominion director of European immigration.

"Canadians are taught to believe that England's day is done, that the greater part of her population is existing on doles, and that the spirit has gone out of her," continues the Post. "Mischievous politicians take pleasure in spreading abroad these falsehoods. We can assure Canadians that if they will seriously determine, in Bruce Walker's phrase to stock Canada with English people, it will be the best day's work they have done yet."

Notes By The Way

(Continued from Page 12) In panic from offered nominations because they knew and their trusted friends advised them that if they were nominated they could not be elected? And yet the Liberal members who then fled to other fields had been elected in most cases by majorities that ran to thousands in 1921. Why then this sudden flight to cover? Does it not show as clearly as the sun at noon day that they felt and feared that there was a mighty storm coming that would sweep away the big majorities of 1921?

Our Liberal friends have reason for these fears. What has so far happened during the campaign, including the facts above set forth, is a record of portents of disaster for the Liberal party on October 29. Big majorities have been swept away and reversed many times since 1867. Recall the elections in which the trade question has been the issue:

1878. The National Policy election. A Liberal majority of 60, elected in 1874 was swept away and replaced by a Conservative protectionist majority of 68. 1882. The National Policy sustained by 65 majority. 1887. National Policy again sustained by 29 majority. 1891. Unrestricted Reciprocity proposed by Liberals and defeated by 31 majority. 1911. Laurier Government submitted treaty of Reciprocity with the United States which was defeated with 47 majority.

These four general elections were the only ones except the present in which protection was the main issue. Protection has never been defeated in Canada since it was first introduced 47 years ago. That is one of the main reasons why the Conservative party is now assured of victory in the coming contest. Protection for farm and factory was never so much needed in Canada as it is today, because the United States tariff was never before so high against us as it is now, and to reduce our tariff, as the King Government has done and propose further to do is the road to national suicide.

Empire Provides Many Puzzles For Foreign Nations OTTAWA, Oct. 16.—The ties that bind the British Empire were dealt with by Sir Fredrick Dutton, of London, England, vice-president of the Royal Colonial Institute, before a joint meeting of the Canadian Club and the Women's Canadian Club here last night.

BRITISH EMPIRE no matter where they lived, Sir Frederick said. There was the possibility of danger in the belief that all sections of the Empire should have equal voice in Empire destinies, that all parts were equal. There was the question of population. New Zealand with its million and a quarter people could not expect an equal voice with the Mother Country's 45,000,000. The protection of the trade routes had been borne until recent years almost exclusively by England, and the heavy taxation there was causing trouble on this account at present.

Epics Of Pioneer Days Recalled At Kruger Unveiling PRETORIA, S. A., Oct. 15.—The epic story of the grim struggle against natural obstacles of the Voortrekkers (Dutch farmers who migrated from Cape Colony to the Vaal in 1835 in an intense desire to be altogether rid of British control) is being recalled in the South African press in connection with the celebration of the 100th anniversary of the birth of Paul Kruger (1825-1904) president of the Transvaal republic at the outbreak of the South African war, 1899.
