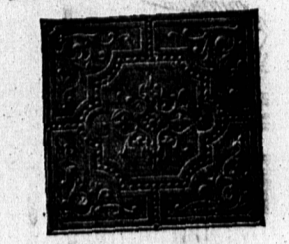

FINE SERVICE.—Despite the wet weather, a fair congregation gathered on Sunday afternoon, October 25th at the Central Bédouque Church. The preacher, Dr. J. J. Sibley, dealt with the Book of Philemon, and told the story of the slave Onesimus. To many it was an entirely new interpretation of the Book, and had read his history, and were familiar with the narrative. NEW YORK, Oct. 30.—Testimony of Millicent Rogers Salm as to certain expenses of her marital venture with the Austrian Count Salm von Hoogstraeten, is under consideration by Supreme Court Justice van Sicken, of Brooklyn.

The heiress to the H. H. Rogers millions, after having protested against being compelled to testify personally in trial of the claim of Dr. Emil Kammerer, Vienna lawyer, for services rendered in getting her marriage validated by the Austrian Government, she appeared in court yesterday for a preliminary hearing. She was the only woman present and lawyers, reporters and the judge looked on, remaining on their feet until the Countess was seated.

While she denies responsibility for Dr. Kramerer's claim of \$6,118 for legal services, she admitted she knew he was employed in getting Austrian Government recognition of her alliance with her much-married husband in order that she might legally bear the title of Countess. She admitted also that she had paid some money to Kramerer.

"I paid other bills of my husband's," she said. She denied that she had ever paid a tax of 1,500,000 kronen to get her title.

The nobel-hated Countess was dressed in gray and wore a rope of pearls around her neck. A reporter asked what kind of fur she wore and she laughed. "She gave her name as Millicent Rogers Salm, but was addressed as 'Countess.'"

When she left the court room photographers asked her to pose, but she said, "No, my pictures never do me justice."
