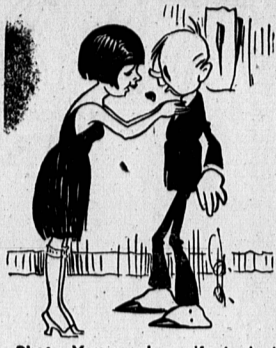

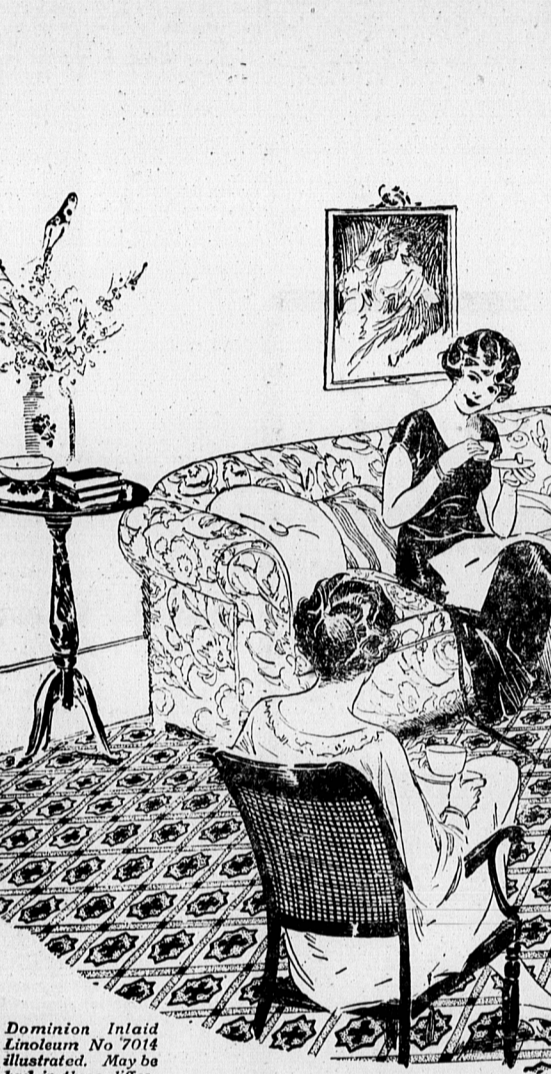

P. E. I. Presbytery of United Church

The P. E. Island Presbytery of the United Church of Canada met on Tuesday Oct. 6 at 11. a. m. in Heartz Hall morning and afternoon sessions. A lot of business was transacted and the attendance of ministers and lay delegates was good. Certain regulations regarding the conduct of Presbytery business were adopted and others sent forth to the committee for further consideration. Sympathy was passed with Rev. Mr. Somers and Rev. Mr. Taitrie who are both sick. Standing committees were appointed and careful consideration given to the reports of the two committees on the allotment of the Budget to Congregations and on the Re-arrangement of Congregational Boundaries. With reference to the latter the following Resolution was passed. "Presbytery commends to Congregations concerned the recommendations of the committee which have been sent to each minister, with instructions that where an appointment is unwilling to accept these findings it be visited by the committee who shall report to another meeting of Presbytery which may issue the matter. If congregations express no disapproval before Dec. 31st, the recommendations will then go into effect."

McLeod, in Kinross, on the evening of Monday, Sept. 28th, to bid farewell to her daughter Christine, who was leaving for Boston on Wednesday morning.
