

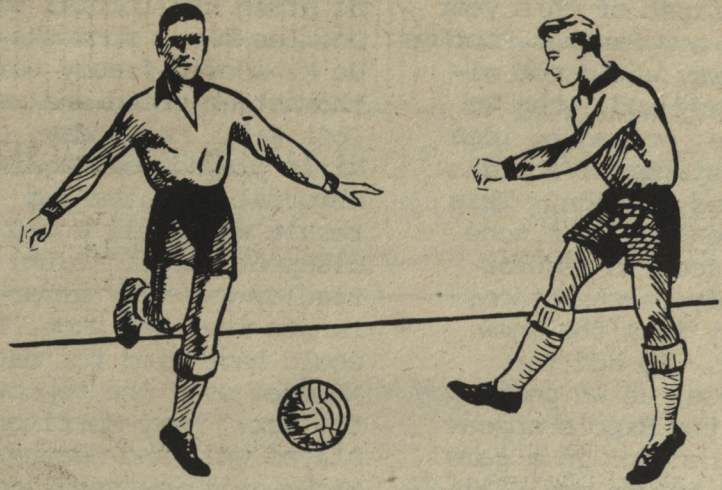
MEN'S INTRAMURALS

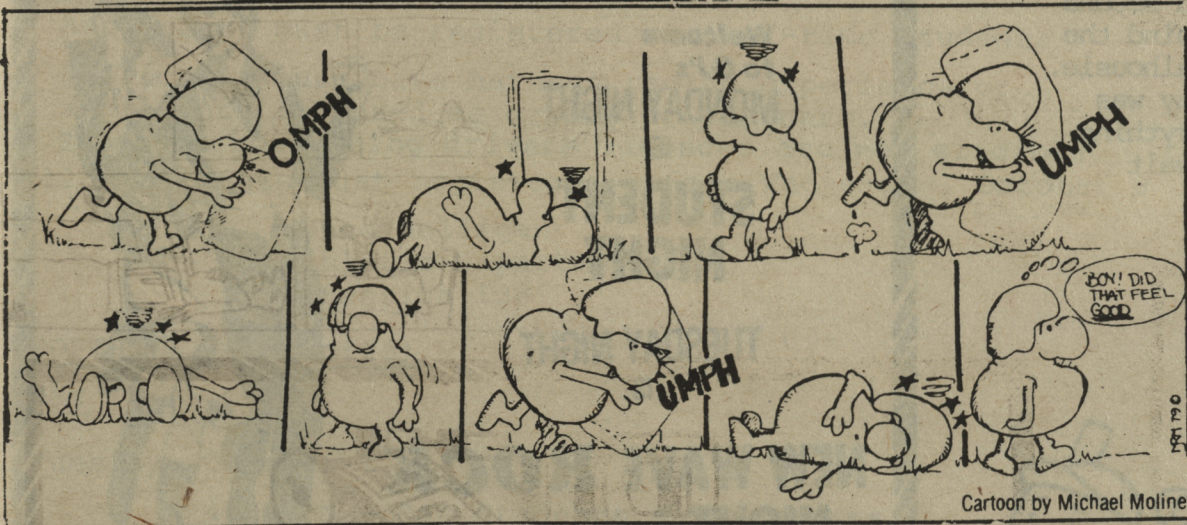

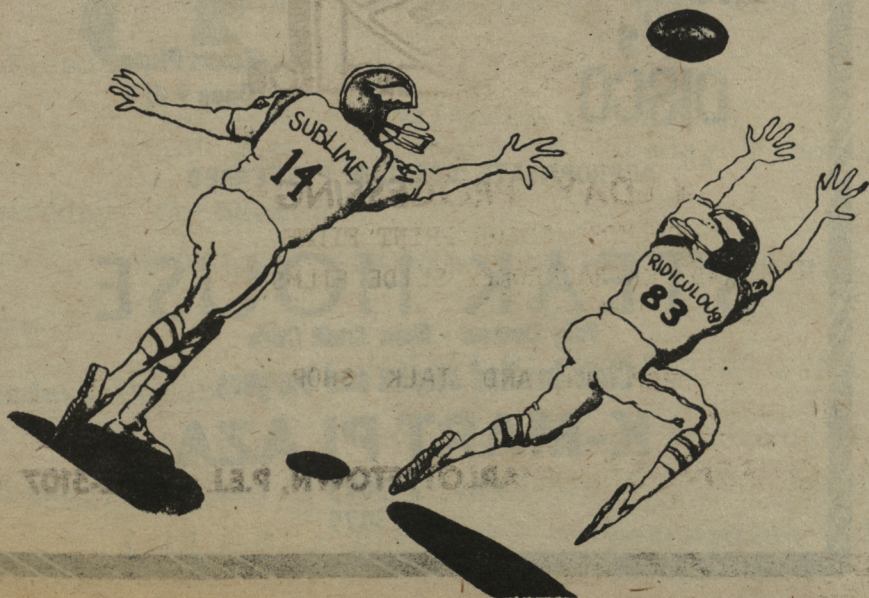
