WHOLE WHEAT PARKER HOUSE ROLLS

Scald
 1 cup milk

Stir in
 3 tbsps. brown sugar
 1 tsp. salt
 3 tbsps. shortening
 Cool to lukewarm.

Measure into large bowl
 1/2 c. lukewarm water

Stir in
 1 tsp. granulated sugar
 Sprinkle with contents of 1 envelope Fleischmann's Active Dry Yeast

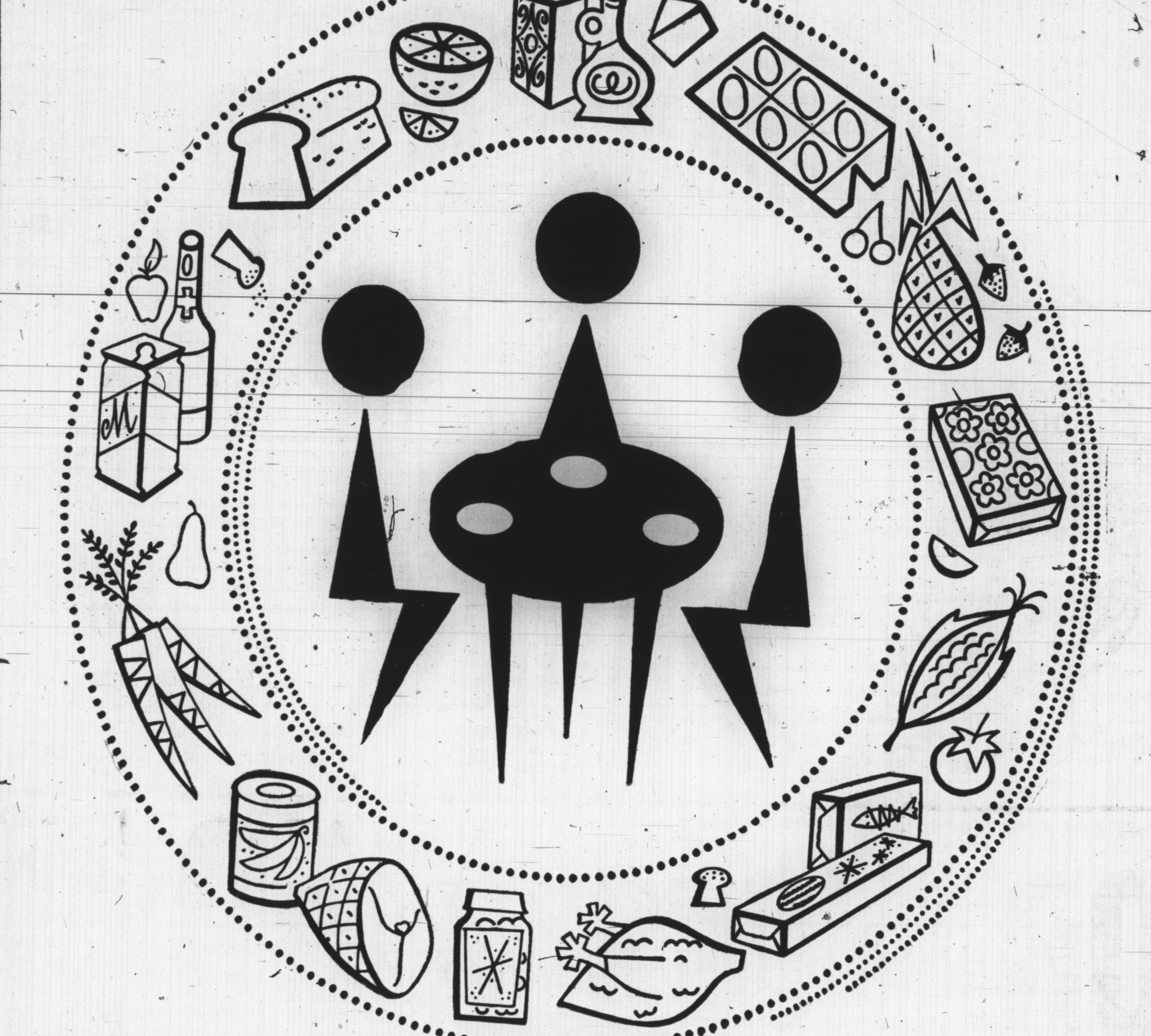
Let stand 10 mins. then stir well. Stir in lukewarm milk mixture.

2 c. whole wheat flour and beat until smooth.

Work in additional
 3/4 c. whole wheat flour
 1 c. (about) once-sifted all-purpose flour

Turn out on floured board; knead until elastic. Place in greased bowl. Grease top. Cover. Let rise in warm place, free from draft, until doubled in bulk, about 1 1/2 hrs. Punch down dough. Turn out on floured board; knead until smooth. Cut dough into 24 equal-sized pieces. Shape pieces into smooth balls. Roll each one into a 2 1/2" x 3 1/2" oval. Fold over crosswise. Place well apart on greased cookie sheets; press edges together lightly. Grease tops. Cover. Let rise until doubled in bulk, about 3/4 hr. Bake in hot oven, 400°, 15 to 20 mins. Yield: 2 doz.
