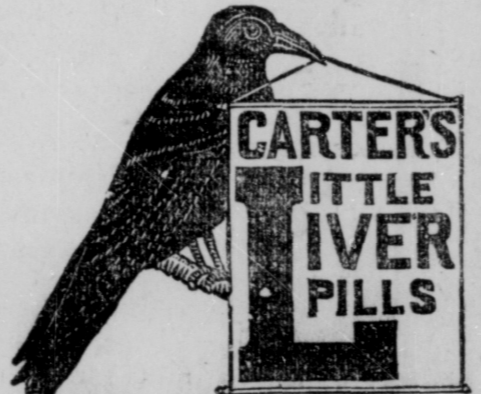
The ventriloquist had bumbled better than he knew and had stepped upon the ride of the four hoboes, who were left behind.

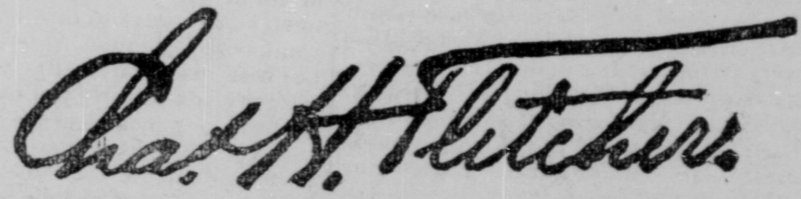

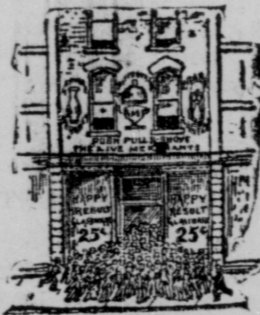
