

Meeting Request Subsidy On Chemical Fertilizers

FERTILIZER ASSISTANCE
Among other matters the Nova Haven meeting went on record calling for provincial subsidy on fertilizer applied to hay, pasture, and grain crops, no doubt this action was the outgrowth of somewhat similar policy in Nova Scotia.
The Nova Scotia plan requires the farmer to purchase at least 200 pounds of commercial fertilizer for each animal unit of

cattle, sheep or hogs. The subsidy will amount to \$20 per ton of fertilizer up to a maximum of 700 pounds per animal unit. No claims under \$20 will be recognized and \$300 will be the upper limit. To qualify for the \$300 the farmer would require 60 or more animal units and would have to purchase at least 21 tons of fertilizer. We wouldn't be very optimistic at the proposal receiving enthusiastic attention by local authorities. First of all Nova Scotia is in a deficiency position for most animal products while this province is in surplus. Further this sort of encouragement is rather alien to public policy in the garden province.
We have recently had directed to us from the University of Wisconsin the announcement of a special course for extension workers June 20 to July 16. Twenty scholarships to the value of \$300 each are available and Canadian are eligible for them. This would seem to be an excellent opportunity for people in the extension field to upgrade

their experience and qualifications.
FARM BUSINESS SERIES
The attention of our readers is directed to the Farm Business television series to be carried on March 29, 30, 31 and April 1 from 10.30 to 11.30 a.m. The entire series will centre around the handling of forage and its conversion into livestock products. Two Island farmers will appear on the program—Wallace Wood of Marshfield and Charles Yeo of St. Eleanor's.
We would like to suggest that an hour spent on each day will be a good investment and a farmer's conscience should not bother him in any respect for being in the house rather than some other location at that time.
DAIRY DAY
"Tomorrow" can be described "As Dairy Day" in the province with both the Dairyman's Association and the Fluid Milk Association holding meetings at the Charlottetown Hotel. The highlight of the sessions will, of course, be the visit of the Hon.

J. J. Greene, Canada's new Minister of Agriculture. Mr. Greene will speak at the dinner and those interested (up to the limit of the accommodation) are invited to attend.
TURNIP PESTICIDE
One of the Island resolutions considered at the CFA called for the certifying of turnip pesticides available in the United States. This resolution has received attention and the CFA reports that upon contacting two chemical firms were advised that the development of products which are expected to be effective in control of the turnip maggot were in the very last stages of testing. One firm expects to apply for registration of its product within two to three weeks and the other firm towards the end of May.
In view of the importance of these products being brought on the Canadian market in time for this season the Department of Agriculture states that if tests made by the chemical firms were satisfactory, approval for use of the products could be obtained within a week.
Another potato went into the

pot on Saturday evening at Carleton Place when a group of growers decided to set up something new in the way of a potato organization. This action apparently grows out of frustration with both the Potato Producer's and the Potato Marketing Board. For the present the new group plans to confine its organizational efforts to Kings County.
For an industry as important as this one to the province to be without really effective organization is more than puzzling, it is actually dangerous.
SEED PLOT
The decision of the government to modify the requirement that table-stock couldn't be planted by stipulated that table-stock growers must have a seed plot this year will no doubt

quiet down some of the noisy opposition.
While we still believe that the requirement to plant seed are sound we see much better possibility of co-operation under the new set up. We have heard the opinion expressed that this compromise will probably lead to the complete elimination of the prohibition on planting table-stock.
