The prize offered by the Rev. W. A. Maclean for the best essay on "What would you do with a million dollars," was won by Miss Ella Arsenault, with the following.—

I would keep enough to make a trip around the world, but not to make my trip too expensive. Then I would build or buy a home in the country where I would like to live, but not make it with too much extravagance either. I would put two or three thousand dollars in the bank of British North America on interest. Another thing, I would like very much to get a good education, and to learn to play several kinds of instruments, to learn also some good trade such as milliner, dressmaker, or bookkeeper. After having learned the trade of milliner, I would start right to work as there is no use of being idle when we can do some good in this world, I would also provide for my parents while they would live.

Where I would like to live is indeed a hard question to reply to. There are many nice places and fine climates. But as I have heard it said that every country has its faults in climate, I think I would live in one that I know. At Ottawa, in Ontario, I would build or buy a home for my parents and myself. Having a trade right in the city I would be near home which would be in a secluded part of the city.

My reasons for living in Ontario would be that it has a healthy and moderate climate, neither very severe in the winter or too warm in summer as it is sometimes here in Manitoba. There is more fruit there also than here. The city of Ottawa is very pretty to my fancy, although it is not very large a great deal of commerce is carried on there, as it is situated near a river. If I ever got tired of my home at Ottawa, I would take a trip once in a while to London, England, or to Rome, in the Holy Land.

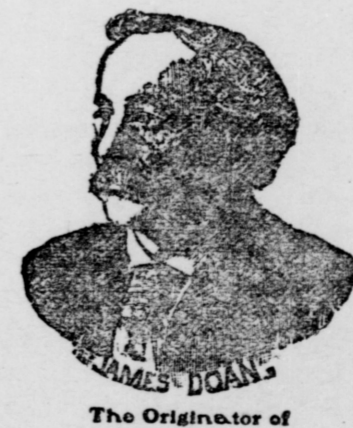
