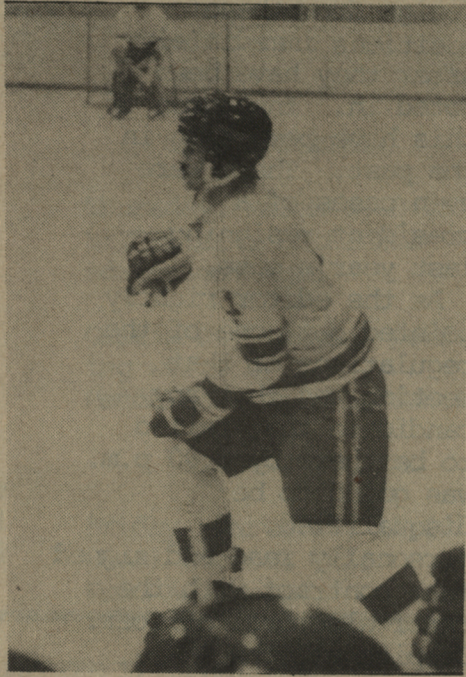


hockey P's graduate! good-bye green & white

weekend.

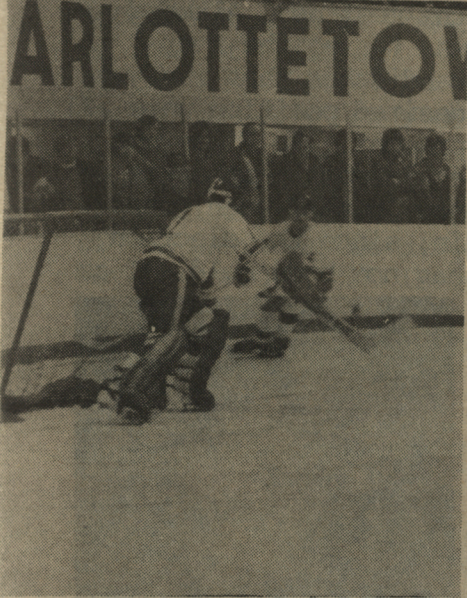
