Bill Aimed At Stopping Criticism

PARIS (AP)—A bill which could virtually stifle press criticism of the de Gaulle government has been introduced in the French National Assembly.

Its legal purpose is "to protect the morale of the army." The proposed law would make it a crime in time of peace to act in such a way as to injure "the morale unity, discipline and chain of command of the army, or to cast doubt on the righteousness of the cause which the army serves under the orders of the government." Broadly interpreted, this could include criticism of any government action.

The bill introduced by five Gaullist deputies would apply not only to the French press but to any foreign journalist writing on French territory.

It would provide jail terms not only for the authors of articles deemed prejudicial to the best interests of the army but to the owners, directors, editors, printers and distributors of the publication carrying the offending article.

France already has such a law on its books, but it is applicable only in time of war.

SUMMERSIDE —

A combined service of Presbyterian, Baptist and United Churches of Summerside, and the Baptist Church of Lot 16, will be held in Summerside Baptist Church this Sunday evening at 7 p.m. where a special service will be preached by Rev. E. M. B. Wheelock, district secretary for New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island for the British and Foreign Bible Society in Canada. A film, "The Leaves of The Tree" will be shown following the service.

Rev. Mr. Wheelock had served nine years in the Baptist ministry in New Brunswick previous to his appointment with the Bible Society, and he is well known in Prince Edward Island.

A graduate in arts and divinity of Acadia University, and Master of Sacred Theology of Andover-Newton Theological School, Mr. Wheelock was invited in 1957 to represent the British and Foreign Bible Society in Canada. During his term of office the Bible House has been established in Charlottetown, and contributions to the work of the society have steadily increased.

During the past year more than four million copies were sent from the Bible House in London in shipments totalling 1,500 tons in weight. These were in 359 languages and dispatched to 53 countries.

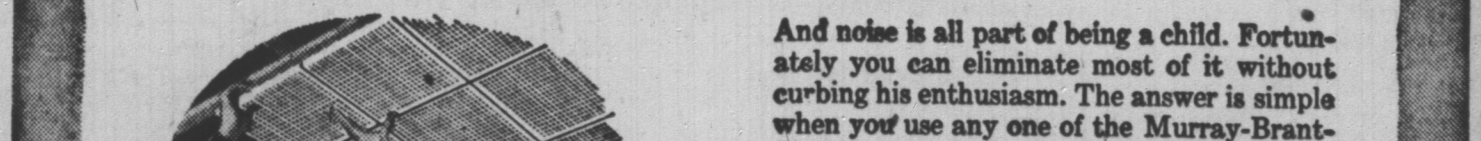
