4. All that land within one mile of the boundary of all Towns, Villages and Parks in the Province. 5. All that land within 540 feet of the centre line of Trans-Canada Highway.

6. All that land within 540 feet of the centre line of the Highway between the Eastern Boundary of the Village of St. Eleanors and Albany Corner. 7. Land adjacent to Beaches
