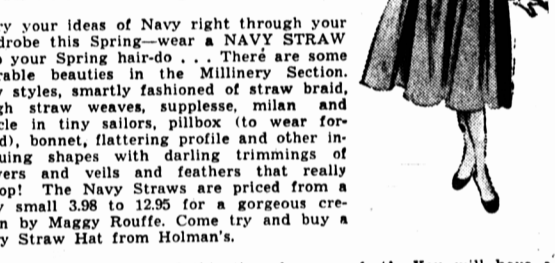

Walter Jones of Charlottetown, P.E.I., who died March 31, just as this great record was being completed.
