Timepieces.
The earliest contrivance for keeping time was the hourglass, which, of uncertain antiquity, was still employed at the beginning of the present century, and, indeed, is now in use on some reading desks in the English churches. On the pulpit of the queen's chapel at Windsor there is a twenty minute glass, which time the orator for the Sunday is advised not to exceed. The clepsydra, or water clock of the Romans, was invented by Scipio Nasica 158 B. C., and toothed wheels were introduced into these pieces of mechanism by Ctesibius about 140 B. C. The earliest complete clock of which there is certain record was made by a Saracenic mechanic in the thirteenth century. The most celebrated clock in the world is that of the cathedral at Strassburg, which tells not only the hour, but the day of the week, the month, the day of the month and the year. It contains a large number of automaton, figures of angels, saints and animals, which appear at regular intervals, and a crowd always assembles at the hour of noon to witness the procession of automaton at that time.

Kipling's Famous Poem.
It is the sentiment, says Arlo Bates in The Atlantic, and not the object, which arouses sympathy and kindles the imagination. No mistake could be more complete than to suppose that in this poem it is to be found any argument in favor of the use of machinery as material for poetry. In "McAndrew's Hymn" it is the character of the staunch old engineer and his feelings by which the reader is moved. The wonders of the great engine are a hindrance, and not a help, if they are looked at in any way other than through the eyes of McAndrew. The piece succeeds or fails to the degree in which it makes his emotion real and contagious to the reader, and that, too, as emotion pure and simple, quite without regard to what has excited it. In so far as the attention is caught by tailrod, crank throws, feeding pump and "purrin dynamos"—finely suggestive as is the epithet in this last—the emotional effect is weakened at the expense of the intellectual.
