Christ's Resurrection Celebrated Yesterday

ALBERTON — The glorious message of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ was proclaimed in all Alberton churches Sunday morning. Hymns of joy and thanksgiving were sung and churches were beautiful with spring flowers.

At the Sacred Heart Church, Holy Saturday's vigil service began at 10:45 p.m. It opened with the blessing of the new fire and the procession with lighted candles through the church, terminating at the altar where the blessing of the Pascal Candle took place.

This was followed by the reading of the prophecies, the Litany of the Saints sung by the choir, and the blessing of the Easter water and the public renewal of baptismal vows.

At the St. Peter's Anglican Church the service of Holy Communion was conducted by the rector, Rev. M.R. Ness.

At the Presbyterian Church worship was conducted by Mr. Donald Ross. The choir selection was "Look, Ye Saints."

At the United Church worship was conducted and the sermon preached by Rev. David MacDonald.

Past Grand Master Gordon Ross, Grand Treasurer Spurgeon Moore, and Deputy Grand Master John Campbell of L.O.L. were also present.

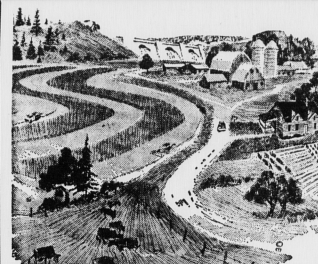

was evacuated. The five-story modern J.C. Penney's store downtown, where at least two died, was rated a total loss.

Roads in outlying sections were badly damaged. The army said 150 soldiers were flown to Seaside because seven bridges were down and the trip couldn't be made by truck.

Electric and sewer services were partly restored in a few areas.

Residents were urged not to use sewer facilities for fear of water pollution and distributed special receptacles in Anchorage.
