ELECTION NOTICE

Every inhabitant of the City possessing the electoral qualification set out as follows:
(a) is of the age of twenty-one years and upwards, and
(b) has resided in the City for at least one year then next preceding the day of such election, and
(c) is a Canadian Citizen, and
(d) shall have paid, on or before the thirty-first day of December, then next preceding the time of the holding of such election all rates, taxes and assessments then due by him

and who shall have paid the poll tax in the amount prescribed under the provisions of this Act for the year preceding such election, or who being by advanced age exempt from assessment for educational or poll tax shall have duly paid the educational or poll tax, or any other civic tax, assessed for the year immediately preceding the year of his or her exemption, and shall in the month immediately preceding the month of any election and before the fifteenth day of the first mentioned month have given to the City Clerk a signed request to be placed on the voter's list, which shall indicate his or her age at the time of request.
