Color Bar Case Heard in Toronto

TORONTO (CP) — Toronto's first hearing under the Fair Accommodation Practices Act opened Friday as Sidney Forbes, Negro father of two children, testified that he was refused an apartment solely because he was colored.

Claiming discrimination, Forbes 36, testified that S. L. Shields of Shields Investments refused last May to rent an apartment to him after he had made a deposit on it.

Shields, who did not appear at Friday's hearing before Judge Douglas C. Thomas, contended that the act does not apply in such cases because it refers to discrimination involving places "anywhere the public is customarily admitted."
