PROTECTOR FROM LIGHTNING.

As generally understood, at present, remarks Dr. Lodge in a contribution to the Engineering Magazine, lightning is an oscillatory discharge of enormous energy, which is a copper rod, however thick and long, can really dispose of harmlessly—experimentally it can be shown, in fact, that when a lightning rod is taken place, even down as far as a rod as this, sparks may fly from it to all conductors near, capable of setting fire to any explosive compound or cylinder with which they may chance to encounter. He therefore recommends for the protection of ordinary buildings the placing of a wire along all gables and down all the corners, with perhaps a few in between along any prominent features, so as to enclose the building in a sort of wire network; any metal serves equally well for the conductor, conductivity being unimportant in comparison with durability; points or projections in the roof should be avoided, and the lightning rods should be connected to the ground by a heavy wire, and earth connection should be made by a heavy wire, and the soil and the pipes therein from being damaged.

NEW SUGAR PROCESS.
