A 65-year-old widow was severely beaten in her home at West Royalty last evening by two unidentified men who were believed to have robbed her as a motive.

Investigating RCMP have issued descriptions of the two men and are appealing to the public to report any persons fitting the description.

Mrs. Elizabeth Spencer, who lived alone across from the Peter Pan drive-in restaurant on the Trans Canada Highway, was kicked and beaten with fists sometime between 8:30 and 10 o'clock last evening.

Mrs. Spencer, who is 65 years old, was severely beaten in her home at West Royalty last evening by two unidentified men who were believed to have robbed her as a motive.

But she was reported badly bruised with skin wounds and cuts. It was not known if she sustained any broken bones although it has been suggested by some sources.

Mrs. Spencer at one time sold vegetables in the old market building. She still runs a small shop part time on Grafton Street. Her husband died a few years ago.

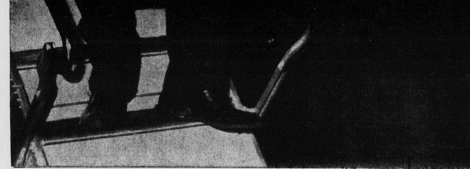

Ottawa Man Is Charged In Export Controls Case

OTTAWA (CP)—David L. Mauder, head of an Ottawa trading company, was charged Friday on 12 counts of violating government export controls by selling, or trying to sell, goods to Russia and Cuba.

One charge alleges that he delivered two "vidicon" tubes to the commercial councillor of the Soviet embassy in Ottawa.

A vidicon tube is similar to a television tube, but is designed to pick up signals from cameras transmitting a weak signal.

Mauder is the head of Timberline Construction and Equipment Limited of Ottawa, a trading company.

A justice department informant was laid in court here Thursday. Mauder was arrested and charged Friday. Bail was set at \$15,000. He will be arraigned Monday.

Thant Suggests More Observers At UN Sessions

By WILLIAM N. OATIS UNITED NATIONS (AP)—Secretary-General U Thant raised the issue of whether to allow additional countries to send United Nations observers to New York where they could keep in touch with this headquarters.

Thant said that countries that could be affected are Communist China, East Germany, North Korea and North Viet Nam. There are roadblocks in each case, due mainly to U.S. non-recognition.

The United Nations now grants observers' facilities here only to non-member governments "which are full members of one or more specialized agencies and are generally recognized by members of the United Nations."

West Germany, South Korea, South Viet Nam, Switzerland, Monaco and the Vatican all request observers in New York but U.S. vetoes them in the public galleries at UN meetings and are given UN documents.
